

# BISHOPS LIFT GENERAL DISPENSATION FROM THE OBLIGATION TO ATTEND MASS

After 465 days, beginning the weekend of **June 26-27**, Arlington Bishop Michael Burbidge and the bishops serving Catholics throughout our region are lifting the general dispensation of the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. I encourage you to read the bishops' joint letter on the matter, which was included in our bulletin last Sunday, June 6, and can be found online at https://www.arlingtondiocese.org/.

As the letter states: "This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus, another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions." If you have questions, please check with me or any of our Saint Mary priests.

I challenge you to look deeply into why God asks us to keep holy the Sabbath and why the Church asks us to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. Jesus Christ offers Himself – Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity – to us in the Eucharist. This extremely personal encounter is the source and summit of our Catholic Faith. Today, we can joyfully view the reinstatement of the need to attend Mass as an invitation to draw ever closer to our Heavenly Father.

And, of course, it will be wonderful seeing you at Mass again!

# Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

### Q: Does receiving Holy Communion erase my sins?

A: It depends. If you are in a state of grace and therefore able to receive Communion, then your venial sins may be wiped away when you receive the Body and Blood of Christ. Mere reception of Holy Communion does not remove venial sin. Rather, when we sincerely pray the penitential rite at the beginning of Mass it disposes our soul to receive worthily and well. Reception also strengthens us to avoid future sin and the near occasion of sin.

As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* explains, this intimate communion with Christ in the Eucharist "separates us from sin. The body of Christ we receive in Holy Communion is 'given up for us,' and the blood we drink 'shed for the many for the forgiveness of sins.' For this reason the Eucharist cannot unite us to Christ without at the same time cleansing us from past sins and preserving us from future sins." (*CCC*1393)

However, if you have committed a mortal, serious sin then you must go to a priest for the Sacrament of Reconciliation to obtain forgiveness of that sin. If you are in a state of mortal sin, you should not receive Holy Communion until you have taken that sin to confession and been absolved by Christ, through the actions and words of the priest.







# FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish

since its founding in 1795.



### **CATHOLIC DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAS** AT SAINT MARY: THE BEGINNING

In 1903, the Daughters of Isabella, the original name of the Catholic Daughters of the Americas, was organized in Utica, NY, as the ladies' auxiliary to the Knights of Columbus. Its mission was to serve "as a charitable, benevolent and patriotic sorority for Catholic ladies." In June 1906, just three years after the group's founding, the Grand Regent of Court Isabella #5 of New York City travelled south to Alexandria to institute Court Kavanaugh #54, the first court in Virginia. By 1908, CDA had 90 courts nationwide and had grown from fewer than 100 members to more than 10,000.



In 1903, Saint Mary's Court Kavanaugh had 34 members. The first Grand Regent for the court was Mrs. Aurelia O'Sullivan, who served as regent for 14 years. Perhaps characteristic of the dedication of early CDA members, Mrs. O'Sullivan was president of Saint Mary's War Camp Community Service, which aided young servicemen stationed in this area during World War I. The women regularly serve them hot, home-made breakfasts and hosted a turkey dinner for them at Christmas. She also chaired the Saint Mary's Convert League, part

of the CDA, created to fight anti-Catholic bigotry through education. The baptismal font at Saint Mary was donated in her memory.

Court Kavanaugh's first chaplain was Father H.J. Cutler, pastor at Saint Mary; the first District Deputy was Dr. Edward Gorman, a prominent local physician and very active member of Saint Mary parish. Since its inception, Court Kavanaugh #54 has been deeply involved in Saint Mary's parish life by sponsoring a variety of events, hosting charitable fundraisers and offering opportunities for spiritual growth.
