The First Joyful Mystery—The Annunciation

Scripture, Luke 1:30-31: And the angel said to her, “Do not fear, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a Son, and you shall name him Jesus.”

Fruit of the Mystery: Humility

The Second Joyful Mystery—The Visitation

Scripture, Luke 1:39 and 41: In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a city of Judah; and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the babe leaped in her womb; and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit.

Fruit of the Mystery: Love of Neighbor

The Third Joyful Mystery—The Nativity

Scripture, Luke 2:10-11: And the angel said to them, “Be not afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people. For to you is born this day in the City of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.”

Fruit of the Mystery: Poverty of Spirit, Detachment from the Things of the World

The Fourth Joyful Mystery—The Presentation

Scripture, Luke 2:22: And when the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord.

Fruit of the Mystery: Obedience

The Fifth Joyful Mystery—The Finding of Jesus in the Temple

Scripture, Luke 2:46: After three days they found him in the Temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions.

Fruit of the Mystery: Joy in Finding Jesus

The First Luminous Mystery—The Baptism of Jesus
Scripture, Matthew 3:16-17: And when Jesus was baptized . . . the heavens were opened and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove, and alighting on Him, and lo, a voice from heaven, saying, “This is my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased.”

Fruit of the Mystery: Openness to the Holy Spirit

The Second Luminous Mystery—The Wedding at Cana
Scripture, John 2:5-7: His mother said to the servants, “Do whatever He tells you.” . . . Jesus said to them, “Fill the jars with water.” And they filled them up to the brim.

Fruit of the Mystery: To Jesus through Mary

The Third Luminous Mystery—The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God

Scripture, Matthew 10:7-8: “And preach as you go, saying, ‘The kingdom of heaven is at hand.’ Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons. You received without pay, give without pay.”

Fruit of the Mystery: Repentance and Trust in God

The Fourth Luminous Mystery—The Transfiguration

Scripture, Luke 9:29 and 35: While He was praying His face changed in appearance and His clothing became dazzling white. And a voice came out of the cloud saying, “This is my chosen Son; listen to Him!”

Fruit of the Mystery: Desire for Holiness

The Fifth Luminous Mystery—The Institution of the Eucharist

Scripture, Luke 22:19: Then he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, “This is My body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of Me.” And likewise, the cup after they had eaten, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which will be shed for you.”

Fruit of the Mystery: Adoration

The First Sorrowful Mystery—The Agony in the Garden

Scripture, Matthew 26:38: Then he said to them, “My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with me.”

Fruit of the Mystery: Sorrow for Sin

The Second Sorrowful Mystery—The Scourging at the Pillar

Scripture, Isaiah 53:5: But he was pierced for our offenses, crushed for our sins: upon him was the chastisement that makes us whole, by his stripes we were healed.

Fruit of the Mystery: Purity

The Third Sorrowful Mystery—The Crowning with Thorns

Scripture, Matthew 27:28-29a: And they stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, and plaiting a crown of thorns, they put it on his head, and put a reed in his right hand.

Fruit of the Mystery: Courage

The Fourth Sorrowful Mystery—The Carrying of the Cross

Scripture, Isaiah 53:7: He was oppressed and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is dumb, so he opened not his mouth.

Fruit of the Mystery: Patience

The Fifth Sorrowful Mystery—The Crucifixion and Death of The Lord

Scripture, Luke 23:32-33: And when they came to the place which is called The Skull, there they crucified him, and the criminals, one on the right and one on the left. And Jesus said, “Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.”

Fruit of the Mystery: Perseverance

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About the Saint Katharine Drexel Society

The Saint Katharine Drexel Society at the Basilica of Saint Mary was founded in June of 2020 in response to recent events of racial injustice. The society prays for the healing of our nation, especially for the healing of historical wounds inflicted by slavery that continue to affect our populace. We pray in reparation for sins of racism, past and present; for the sacredness of every human life to be protected and upheld, both in law and in culture; and for the unity of human society under the peaceful Lordship of Jesus Christ. The group prays the Rosary during the Basilica's Holy Hour on Wednesdays from 7:30-8:30 p.m. and meets at other times for prayer and fellowship. Father David Dufresne is the group's chaplain.

Catholic teaching encourages reparations not only for our own sins, but through the virtue of the Communion of the Saints and the oneness of the mystical Body of Christ, to also make reparation for the sins of others. Through our prayers, we ask God to heal our community, our state, our country, and the world.

The patroness of the society, Saint Katharine Drexel (1858-1955), was the second American-born Saint to be canonized by the Catholic Church. Born in Philadelphia and raised in a wealthy family, she gave up her affluent lifestyle to enter religious life. She used her inheritance to minister to the poor and oppressed. She founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, which went on to establish over 100 schools that served Native American reservations and Southern African American inner city and rural communities. The Sisters never wavered in their mission, even when they received threats and their buildings were vandalized.

Saint John Paul II canonized Katharine Drexel in 2000. In his homily during the canonization Mass, he said, "She taught a spirituality based on prayerful union with the Eucharistic Lord and zealous service of the poor and the victims of racial discrimination. Her apostolate helped to bring about a growing awareness of the need to combat all forms of racism through education and social services. Katharine Drexel is an excellent example of that practical charity and generous solidarity with the less fortunate, which has long been the distinguishing mark of American Catholics."

Saint Katharine's love for the Eucharist, her spirit of prayer, and her Eucharistic perspective on the unity of all peoples are key inspirations for our holy hour.
