

The veils dramatically remove from our sight the familiar, sacred images that console and comfort us, Instead, our attention is focused on the gift and true meaning of Christ's Passion. They also provide a heightened sense of anticipation for Easter Sunday, especially if you attend Mass during the week and see them each day.

I encourage your family to veil prominent religious images in your home, as well. This is a beautiful tradition to pass down to children, who tend to be fascinated by the process, making it spiritually significant for them.

Liturgical Calendar This Week

April 4. Saint Isidore, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. Succeeded his brother, Saint Leander, as bishop of Seville; presided over the Council of Toledo (631); combatted Arianism in Spain. Known as the "Schoolmaster of the Middle Ages." April 5. Saint Vincent Ferrer, Priest. Order of Preachers. Noted orator and missionary preacher. Called the "Angel of Judgment"; worked tirelessly for the unity of the Church. Died in 1419.

April 7. Saint John Baptist de la Salle, Priest. Canon of the Diocese of Rhiems; gave away his fortune to found (1680) the Brothers of the Christian Schools, today numbering some 4,975 religious; author of the *Conduct of Schools*; patron of teachers.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: What is Arianism?

A: It was a fourth-century heresy that denied the divinity of Christ. It was promoted by Arius (256-336), a priest of Alexandria, Egypt, who in 318 began teaching his belief that there are not three distinct persons in God, co-eternal and equal in all things, but only one person, the Father. Arius declared that the Son is only a creature and, as a mere creature, is not infinite or eternal.

The First Council of Nicea was convened in 325 to counter Arianism. A key opponent of Arian beliefs was Saint Athanasius (296-373), Bishop of Alexandria, who was present at the Council, which formally affirmed the divinity of Christ.

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish since its founding in 1795



JESUIT BROTHERS SERVING AT SAINT MARY

Although their names are only mentioned twice in our old parish records, since they were not priests and did not administer the sacraments, Jesuit brothers served at Saint Mary in the early 1800s.



Saint John's Academy Cadets, Alexandria, VA, c. 1860

When Father John Smith opened Saint John's Academy, a school for boys, in 1833 (on the northwest corner of Duke and Royal Streets), he was ably assisted by Jesuit Brother John Bridgon, who taught mathematics and English. In fact, according to records maintained by the Jesuits, Father Smith was busy with pastoral duties so Brother Bridgon essentially ran the school.

The other entry in our parish records is for Brother Edmund Quinlan, who died while at Saint Mary. Father Ignatius Combs, S.J., Saint Mary's pastor, wrote:

Brother Edmund Quinlan, S.J., died at 3:30 p.m. Saturday. His funeral services performed in the church. Sermon by Rev. Early, after which the body was conveyed to Georgetown College to the religious burial ground. Br. Quinlan was born on the 6th June 1797 and died on the 6th of June 1845. R.I.P. -- June 6, 1845. Ign. Combs
