

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

Wednesday, August 4: Feast of Saint Jean Marie Vianney, the Curé d'Ars, patron and role model for parish priests. Born in a small French town in 1786, he was a compassionate spiritual counselor who spent up to 16 hours every day hearing confessions. In January 2019, we were honored to have the relic of Saint Jean Vianney's incorrupt heart here at the Basilica for several days of veneration (https://stmaryoldtown.libsyn.com/the-basilica-of-saint-mary-podcast-episode-16). It is good to remember that visit and consider this holy man's beautiful words: "The priesthood is the love of the heart of Jesus" — as we pray for all priests and for an increase in vocations.

Thursday, August 5: Memorial of the Dedication of the Basilica of Saint Mary Major, formerly known as the Dedication of the Church of Our Lady of the Snows. According to legend, a Roman patrician and his wife vowed to give their possessions to the Virgin Mary and prayed to ask her how to do that. On August 5, 352, at the height of the Roman summer, snow fell during the night as Mary appeared to the couple and Pope Liberius, directing them to build a church on Rome's Esquiline Hill in her honor. That church became Saint Mary Major. Each year on August 5, white rose petals are dropped from the dome at the conclusion of Mass there, symbolizing Our Lady's purity, blessings and graces.

Friday, August 6: Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, the revelation of Christ's divine glory. After telling His disciples He would be put to death in Jerusalem, Christ went up Mount Tabor with Peter, James and John. "He was transfigured before them. And His face did shine as the sun and His garments became white as snow" (Matthew 17:2). The manifestation of Christ's divine nature offers us a glimpse of the eternal glories of heaven and the resurrected body promised to all Christians.

The Portiuncula Indulgence is a plenary indulgence available on **August 2**, under the usual conditions (Confession, Holy Communion, prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father, complete detachment from sin), for all who visit a parish church and pray there the Our Father and the Creed. The history of this indulgence goes back to Saint Francis of Assisi and the small chapel of Our Lady of the Angels, which is at the heart of the Francis-



can Order and the place where Saint Francis died. In his devotion to this site, a source of so many graces for himself and his friars, Francis sought and obtained special permission for an indulgence for anyone who visited the chapel on August 2. The indulgence was later expanded to all Franciscan churches and then expanded to include any parish church.

Saints on the Calendar This Week

- •August 2. Saint Eusebius of Vercelli, Bishop. Founder of the canons regular of the West, uniting clerical and monastic life; tortured and exiled to Palestine by Constantine. Died in 371. Saint Peter Julian Eymard, Priest. Founded (1856) Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament, devoted to the Eucharist as center of the life of the Church and society. Died in 1868.
- •August 4. Saint Jean Marie Vianney, Priest. Curé d'Ars, patron of parish priests. As a seminarian, he struggled with school, especially Latin. At his ordination in 1815, the vicar general said, "The Church wants not only learned priests but, even more, holy ones." Died on August 4, 1859; canonized May 31, 1925.
- •August 5. Dedication of the Basilica of Saint Mary Major. Oldest basilica in the West dedicated to the Mother of God; dedicated in Rome by Pope Sixtus after the declaration of Mary as Theotokos ("God-bearer") by the Council of Ephesus in 431.
- •August 6. Transfiguration of the Lord. Transfigured in glory, the Son of Man has received kingship and dominion and will come again in glory. Celebrated since the 5th century, officially included in the general calendar in 1457.
- •August 7. Saint Sixtus II, Pope, and Companions, Martyrs. Arrested in August 258 while celebrating Mass in the cemetery of Callistus; decapitated that same day. Saint Cajetan, Priest. Co-founded (1524) with Gian Pietro Carafa (later Pope Paul IV) the Theatines (Congregation of Clerks Regular).

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: What are the "synoptic Gospels"?

A: The gospels of the first three evangelists, Matthew, Mark and Luke, are called the "synoptic gospels" ("synoptic" means to see with one lens) because all three are written in a chronological format whereas the Gospel of Saint John is structured thematically.

SAINT MARY'S STAINED GLASS WINDOWS: An Overview



Beautiful stained glass windows are among the Basilica of Saint Mary's most striking features. Over the years, they have graphically catechized the devout faithful while memorializing many of our parish founders. In the earliest days of the parish, the windows helped educate and inspire parishioners, some of whom were illiterate or may not have had access to Bibles or other books.

Artisans and glass makers from Germany and various sites in the United States made a majority of the windows in the late 19th century. Most are the work of the Herman T. Gernhardt Class Company of Baltimore. Many of the more re-

cent windows were designed by New York ecclesiastical artist Francis Sturm and installed approximately 60 years after the main body of the church was built, to commemorate the parish centenary in 1895.

The oldest windows are those closest to the sanctuary, installed when the church was remodeled by Saint Mary's first diocesan pastor, Fr. Henry J. Cutler, in 1895. Others were added at various times in the early 20th century and following the fire that struck the church in 1929. In 1948, Monsignor Edward Stephens, Saint Mary pastor from 1943 to 1959, added five windows: four in the choir loft commemorating the North American Martyrs, and the window depicting Jesus and Nicodemus in the former baptismal niche near the church entrance, now the location of the statue of Saint Thomas More.


