QUEENSHIP OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY – August 22



Monday, August 22, is the conclusion of the octave of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and is celebrated as the Queenship of Mary. In proclaiming this feast in 1954, Pope Pius XII wrote in his encyclical, *Ad Caeli Reginam*: "From the earliest ages of the Catholic Church, a Christian people, whether in time of triumph or more especially in time of crisis, has addressed prayers of petition and hymns of praise and veneration to the Queen of Heaven. And never has that hope wavered which they placed in the Mother of the Divine King, Jesus Christ; nor has

that faith ever failed by which we are taught that Mary, the Virgin Mother of God, reigns with a mother's solicitude over the entire world, just as she is crowned in heavenly blessedness with the glory of a Queen." Pope Pius XII also declared that, on this feast day each year, the world should renew its consecration to Mary, Our Queen. Here at the Basilica of Saint Mary, we will do that at the conclusion of each of our regular daily Masses (6:30 a.m., 8 a.m. and 12:10 p.m.) on **Monday August 22**, with a special prayer of consecration:

Act of Consecration to Mary, Our Queen O Mary Immaculate Queen, glorious Queen of the Universe,

most powerful Virgin, merciful Mother of a merciful
God and refuge of sinners, we consecrate ourselves
to your royal and Immaculate Heart.

It is through you that Jesus Christ our King has come into the world
to save it. It is also through you that He is to reign over the world.
In order to obtain this great benefit for ourselves and all mankind,
we come to your feet to consecrate to you our persons, our lives,
all that we are, all that we have, all that we love.
Keep us, enlighten us, dispose of us, reign over us.
May all hearts and all homes willingly proclaim you
as their Immaculate Queen. Amen.
(End with three Hail Mary's)

Liturgical Calendar This Week

<u>August 22. The Queenship of Mary</u>. This memorial, prescribed in 1954 by Pope Pius XII for May 31, is now fittingly celebrated on the octave day of the Assumption.

August 23. Saint Rose of Lima, Virgin. Peruvian mystic and first declared saint of the New World. Dominican tertiary who lived a life of penance and solitude, caring for the homeless, elderly and sick. Died in 1617 at the age of 31. August 24. Saint Bartholomew, Apostle. First century. Known as Nathaniel in Saint John's Gospel. May have preached in India and Armenia where, according to tradition, he was flayed alive.

August 25. Saint Louis. King Louis IX of France. Model ruler; father of 11 children; Franciscan tertiary who cared especially for lepers. While on crusade, he died of the plague near Tunis in 1270. Saint Joseph Calasanz, Priest. Founded (1617) Clerics Regular of Religious Schools, today about 1,375 religious, dedicated to helping poor children.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

In preparation for its 50th anniversary, the Diocese of Arlington is marking this year with the theme: "Remember," reflecting on the Eucharist and Christ's words at the Last Supper: "Do this in remembrance of me." An article in the Arlington Catholic Herald (June 30-July 13, 2022), "The Eucharist Explained," explores various aspects of Holy Communion. Following is an excerpt from that article:

Q: Why do we have adoration?

A: During adoration, a consecrated host is placed in a monstrance, or sacred vessel made of gold or silver, on the altar for people to see while they pray. In the time of the Old Testament, God was physically present to the Israelites in the Holy of Holies, which held the Ark of the Covenant. It was a visible presence of God who wished to share His life with humans.

Echoing that earlier tradition, the Church teaches today that Christ continues to dwell on Earth in the Eucharist and many desire to adore Christ while in physical proximity to Him. Saint Paul VI said, "To visit the Blessed Sacrament is a proof of gratitude, an expression of love and a duty of adoration toward Christ our Lord."

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish since its founding in 1795



FIRST PUBLIC CATHOLIC MASS IN ALEXANDRIA

The first known public Catholic Mass in Alexandria was celebrated in 1781 by a chaplain serving in the French expeditionary forces of General Marshall Jean-Baptiste-Donatien de Vimeur, Comte de Rochambeau. His troops, sent to the colonies in 1780 to assist in the United States' rebellion against Great Britain, were instrumental in helping General George Washington secure a victory at Yorktown.

That first Mass was celebrated in a frame chapel located at Pitt and North Princess Street. Masses at the chapel were discontinued when Rochambeau sailed from Virginia in 1782. That void increased the need for another place for Alexandria's Catholics to worship.

On Saint Patrick's Day in 1788, Colonel John Fitzgerald, aide de camp to General Washington and a well-known and popular host in Alexandria, invited a group of prominent Maryland and Virginia citizens, including General Washington, to his home for dinner. Of course, affairs of government were uppermost

in their minds as the states were debating whether to ratify the Constitution. However, another topic of interest to Alexandria Catholics was discussed: the need for a Catholic church in the town. Colonel Fitzgerald agreed to head the drive for funds. Thornton Alexander, an heir of John Alexander, Alexandria's founder, agreed to donate an acre of land at the corner of Washington and Church Streets where Saint Mary Cemetery is located today. In his journal, George Washington – an Anglican – recorded that he attended the Fitzgerald party and noted he had made a sizable contribution to the start of the church. — Kitty Guy, Parish Historian
