

#### A THANK YOU FROM THE DIOCESE OF MANDEVILLE

Today's Gospel reading from Luke (14:1,7-14) includes these words from Christ: "...when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Parishioners of Saint Mary had an opportunity to live the spirit of those words when Father Gary Wiesmann, Director of Mission Awareness for the Diocese of Mandeville, Jamaica, spoke at our Masses the weekend of July 16 and 17. He was here to appeal for help in meeting the needs of his very poor diocese. Basilica of Saint Mary parishioners rose to the occasion by donating nearly \$90,000 in a special collection for Father Wiesmann's flock.

I recently received a thank-you letter from Father Wiesmann. He writes: "You can't imagine how much we appreciate this support and care.... This gift helps us to evangelize those who have not yet come to know the Lord, provide for some of the basic needs of the poor, educate the young, house destitute elderly persons in a dignified way and put a roof over the heads of families without a home."

He continues: "Your parish family has blessed the poor with some of what they deserve as God's children; I am confident that the good Lord will bless you and your parishioners for this most generous sacrifice for our poor. Truly, '...the Lord hears the cry of the poor' and has touched the hearts of your parish as they have so generously responded in the Lord's name. We are very grateful! You have a wonderful and very welcoming parish."

Let me echo Father Wiesmann's sentiments. You, our parishioners, ARE wonderful and always willing to share your treasure with the less fortunate. God bless you!

#### THE PASSION OF SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST, August 29

The Passion, or Beheading, of Saint John the Baptist is one of the oldest liturgical feasts on the Church calendar. It likely was commemorated as soon as the Church began commemorating events of any kind.

John is the only saint, other than Our Lady and Saint Joseph, to have more than one feast day! In addition to marking his martyrdom and death on August 29, we celebrate his birth on June 24. That may be the oldest feast in his honor. A third feast was celebrated on September 23 in the Eastern Church in honor of "Saint John's Conception," commemorating the fact that

an angel announced his conception. That feast, however, was not adopted by the Latin (Roman Catholic) Church.



John had the audacity to denounce King Herod Antipas, to his face, for divorcing his lawful wife and marrying Herodias, his sister-in-law and the wife of his still-living brother, Philip. (John's beheading came at the request of Salome, daughter of Herodias and Philip — so she was both the niece and step-daughter of Herod Antipas!) As a result of his boldness, John was imprisoned and then killed for defending the dignity of marriage and family. May we, too, be courageous and truthful in defending the moral foundations of our Catholic faith.

#### Liturgical Calendar This Week

**August 29. The Passion of Saint John the Baptist.** Anniversary of Saint John's martyrdom. The feast originates in the celebration of the dedication, perhaps on this day, of the Church of Saint John at Sebaste (Samaria) where, according to tradition, John was buried by his disciples.

September 3. Saint Gregory the Great, Pope and Doctor of the Church. Order of Saint Benedict; papal legate to Constantinople. Noted for liturgical reform and chant; sent missionaries to England. One of four great doctors of the Latin Church. Patron saint of music.

## Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

In preparation for its 50th anniversary, the Diocese of Arlington is marking this year with the theme "Remember," reflecting on the Eucharist and Christ's words at the Last Supper: "Do this in remembrance of me." An article in the Arlington Catholic Herald (June 30-July 13, 2022), "The Eucharist Explained," explores various aspects of Holy Communion, incorporating information from Matthew Tsakanikas, theology professor at Christendom College. Following is an excerpt from that article:

#### Q: What is the unconsecrated communion host made of?

A: Catholics use grape wine and wheat bread for Communion. "Christ chose that matter," said Tsakanikas. In 2017, the Vatican declared that "the bread (for Roman Catholics) must be unleavened, purely of wheat, and recently made so that there is no danger of decomposition. The wine must be natural, from the fruit of the grape, pure and incorrupt, not mixed with other substances. Low-gluten hosts are permitted, but no-gluten hosts are not. Hosts that are completely gluten-free are invalid matter for the celebration of the Eucharist. Low-gluten hosts (partially gluten-free) are valid matter, provided they contain a sufficient amount of gluten to obtain the confection of bread without the addition of foreign materials and without the use of procedures that would alter the nature of bread.



## FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish since its founding in

#### THE CRUSADERS

The Crusaders, a young adult organization, grew out of the national Catholic Students Mission Crusade and was extremely popular at Saint Mary in the 1920s and 1930s. The Crusaders had three goals: educate Catholics on missionary needs and activities, pray for the success of the Church's universal mission, and provide financial aid for missionaries, at home and abroad.

One of the nation's first Crusaders units for those who had graduated from high school (known as "Veteran Units") was established at Saint Mary. John Lannon was its first president. The Saint Mary group sponsored frequent social activities, met with members from other parishes in the Richmond Diocese and held regular conventions. (NOTE: Saint Mary parish was part of the Richmond Diocese until 1954 when the Arlington Diocese was created.) They also sponsored popular overnight trips on the Old Bay Liner, "the Norfolk Boat." They danced the night away and were met by Crusaders from Holy Trinity Parish in Norfolk/Ocean View when they arrived. They stayed with their Norfolk hosts, enjoyed a weekend at the beach and formed lasting friendships. There were many marriages between Crusaders. Father Thomas Rankin, Saint Mary's pastor, was such an enthusiastic supporter of such unions that he acquired the affectionate nickname of "Marrying

Tom." The Crusaders also presented popular plays in the Lyceum every season. They held numerous picnics, some after they had completed volunteer service. They adopted then-tiny All Saints Church in Manassas (way out in the country in those days), and provided all the bread and wine for its Masses. The young men wired the church for electricity. They drove children from Sacred Heart Mission (now Saint Louis Parish) to Sunday Mass and religion classes, sponsored Christmas parties for poor children and delivered Christmas Eve dinners to needy families.

The organization was popular until World II, when young men went to war and young ladies found government defense jobs. After the war, many married and settled down to raise families. The group was never restarted by younger generations, but remained a fond memory for its many former members. — Kitty Guy, Parish Historian
