Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: What does "Mass" mean and why do we Catholics use the word?

A: The name Mass comes from the Latin phrase *Ite, missa est* pronounced by the priest or deacon at the conclusion of the celebration of the Catholic liturgy. It is taken from the term *missio* or to "send forth" those who had participated in the liturgy. It was some time after Gregory the Great (d. 604) that the word was applied to the entire liturgy.

In his encyclical *Sacramentum Caritatis*, Pope Benedict XVI wrote, "In antiquity, *missa* simply meant 'dismissal.' However, in Christian usage it gradually took on a deeper meaning. The word 'dismissal' has come to imply a 'mission.' "

Rather than seeing the words of the priest or deacon as a conclusion to the celebration, Pope Benedict saw them as a beginning. He made that abundantly clear when he developed new words for the dismissal we now hear at Mass:, "Ite ad Evangelium Domini annuntiandum (Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord)" and "Ite in pace, glorificando vita vestra Dominum (Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life)." Both dismissals focus on the missionary character of the Mass and how all those who participate in it are to go out into the world, sustained by the Eucharist they have just received.

The annual Memorial Mass for Father Vincent R. Capodanno takes place at 6:30 p.m., **Tuesday, September 7**, in the Crypt Church of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC. Main celebrant will be His Excellency, the Most Reverend Timothy P. Broglio, Archbishop for the Archdiocese for the Military Services. Celebrated in memory of Father Capodanno, killed in Vietnam on September 4, 1967, as he aided embattled Marines. He posthumously received the Medal of Honor; May 2006, the Catholic Church officially proclaimed him a Servant of God, initiating his Cause for Canonization. All are invited to the Memorial Mass. SAINT MARY'S STAINED GLASS WINDOWS (continued)

Windows on the south side of the Basilica (on your right as you face the altar) are among the oldest at Saint Mary. Beginning in the front at the sanctuary, the first two windows are:

Saint Andrew and Saint John the Baptist. Both windows were donated by the Sodalities of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The window depicting Saint Andrew was dedicated to the memory of Father Andrew Keating, SJ, assistant pastor at Saint Mary from 1875-80. Father Keating was very involved with the Sodality of the Blessed Virgin Mary and organized the sodality for Black parishioners. He died at Saint Peter's College in New Jersey when he was just 52. The window of Saint John the Baptist was dedicated in memory of Father John De Wolf, SJ, assistant pastor at Saint May 1851-52. Father de Wolf was a native of East Flanders (Holland). After his ordination he served a number of parishes in Southern Maryland. Like Father Keating, he was the moderator of the parish sodalities.





The Holy Family. This depiction of the Holy Family shows Jesus as a young boy, learning from His foster father, Saint Joseph. Jesus is carrying a ruler (you can see the numbers on the sides), foreshadowing the wood of His cross. It was dedicated in memory of Thomas N. Scott and Family. Scott, originally from Ireland, owned a carpentry firm at 113 South Pitt Street in the late 19th century. His firm did the carpentry work in the church when it was enlarged in 1883. He also helped build the parish Lyceum and did the 1894-95 renovation of the church. In 1916, Scott donated the statue of Our Lady of Lourdes in the niche above the front entrance to the Basilica. He and his family lived at 415 South Fairfax Street. He died on April 20, 1917; he and members of his family are buried in our parish cemetery.
