SANCTIFYING OUR LEISURE TIME

Late summer is often a time to seek respite and relaxation from our usual, day-to-day work and family schedules. Vacations offer a necessary and healthy balance to our lives. (I will be taking time this month, August 13-27, to attend my annual formation workshop with the Priestly Society of the Holy Cross – part fraternal to re-connect with priest friends, part retreat focused on living our spiritual plan of life in community and part ongoing study. Be assured you will be in my prayers!)

Each of us should pause, on a regular basis, to renew our minds and bodies. It also is important to attend to our spiritual selves, our souls. There are many good ways to help keep God as the center of our lives. One is the Morning Offering, through which we dedicate our entire day to God, asking that He bless and sanctify our every thought, word and action. Since we do not want to offer God anything offensive, we can begin the day by offering our intention to avoid sin. With the assistance of God and the angels and saints, we are better able to engage the challenges of each new day. Below is a traditional prayer you might use or adapt:

Morning Offering

O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer You my prayers, works, joys and sufferings of this day for all the intentions of Your Sacred Heart, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, in reparation for my sins, for the intentions of all my relatives and friends, and in particular for the intentions of our Holy Father. Liturgical Calendar This Week

August 8. Saint Dominic, Priest. Dominic de Guzman was born in 1221 in Caleruega, Spain. Founded the Order of Preachers (O.P.) — the Dominicans — today numbering some 5,770 religious worldwide. Their fraternal, community form of life is devoted to contemplation, study and preaching.

August 9. Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, Virgin

and Martyr. Edith Stein, born in Germany in 1891 of Jewish parents. Inspired by Saint Teresa of Avila, she was baptized in 1922. She taught school until she was forced to resign due to anti-Semitism. Entered Discalced Carmelite convent in Cologne in 1933. Arrested in 1942, sent to Poland, killed on August 9 at Auschwitz.

August 10. Saint Lawrence, Deacon and Martyr.

Martyred in 258 AD, four days after Pope Sixtus II and four other deacons were killed. Said to have been burned alive on a gridiron. Venerated as a patron of Rome. August 11. Saint Clare of Assisi, Virgin. Disciple of Saint Francis. Founded the Poor Clares, directed their first convent, at San Damiano in Assisi, for 42 years. Led an austere life rich in the practice of charity. Died in 1253. August 12. Saint Jane Frances de Chantal, Religious. From Dijon, France; married to Baron de Chantal; mother of six children. As a widow, with Saint Francis de Sales, her spiritual director, founded the Sisters of the Visitation of Holy Mary (Visitandines) in 1610.

August 13. Saints Pontian, Pope, and Hippolytus, Priest, Martyrs. Pope Pontian was banished by Maximinius Thrax to Sardinia and reconciled with Hippolytus. Before dying in 235, he abdicated his office to make way for his successor, Saint Anterus. Hippolytus, a stern rigorist, was exiled to Sardinia with Pontian. Source of Eucharistic Prayer II.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

In preparation for its 50th anniversary, our Arlington Diocese is marking this year with the theme: "Remember," reflecting on the Eucharist and Christ's words during the Last Supper: "Do this in remembrance of me." An article in the Arlington Catholic Herald (June 30-July 13, 2022), "The Eucharist Explained," explores various aspects of Holy Communion, incorporating information from Matthew Tsakanikas, a theology professor at Christendom College. Following is an excerpt from that article:

Q: Why isn't the Precious Blood usually offered to Mass-goers?

A: Since Christ is fully present in both the consecrated bread and wine, those who receive only the host receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace, according to section 1390 of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. This is the most common way of receiving Communion in the Latin Rite, or Roman Catholic Church. Eastern Rite Catholics usually receive Holy Communion under both species, bread and wine.



Joe was released from jail and immediately was given a job at the car wash off Henry in north Old Town. This, and another car wash in Del Ray, hire people like Joe to give them a fresh start. The wages are low, but hard work and generous tips give people like Joe a decent life and, more importantly, hope.

Joe finally found an affordable apartment that he shares, but fell behind in his rent as inflation wrecked his carefully planned budget. Just like those who seek a new life after beating drug addiction, those who know the pains of jail time do not want to go back. We at SVdP do not inquire about their previous life. We view them as children of God, who may have strayed, but like the prodigal son, have returned. When you donate to SVdP, you are helping a prodigal child return to their family. 

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish since its founding in 179:

VIRGINIA'S EARLIEST CATHOLIC SETTLERS MEMORIALIZED

Although Saint Mary's official founding date was in 1795, its roots go back to the first Catholics to permanently settle in Virginia. Gentlewoman Margaret Brent, with her brother Giles Brent and his family, wealthy Maryland colonists, left Saint Mary's City when the Puritans took control (1649) and persecuted Catholics. The Brents acquired a huge land grant in Virginia and moved across the Potomac River to Aquia in Stafford County. Although the practice of Catholicism was forbidden by law at that time, Virginia's colonial government allowed Catholics in this area to worship peacefully. The Brent colony welcomed all faiths and encouraged toleration of other religious beliefs. Their land extended as far as Alexandria, including Saint Mary Cemetery. A number of Brents in subsequent generations settled along the river, including George Washington's neighbors,



the Clifton and Slaughter families, and George Mason's wife, Sarah Brent. Since Saint Mary's territory originally extended as far south as Fredericksburg, Aquia and the Brent colony were part of the parish and the true origin of Saint Mary Church.

To commemorate the first Catholic settlers in Virginia, and the first example of religious freedom in the American colonies, the Virginia Catholic Women's Club erected a huge bronze crucifix along Route 1 (Richmond Highway) at Aquia in Stafford County, near the tiny Brent family cemetery. Bishop Andrew J. Brennan of Richmond purchased a plot of land, and the cross was dedicated in 1931. Father Richard Blackburn Washington, a collateral descendant of George Washington, participated. His father was the last Washington born in Mount Vernon. The Knights of Columbus sponsored a commemorative Mass, an annual tradition that continues to this day.
