REJOICE, THE LORD IS NEAR!

Today, the Third Sunday of Advent, is known as Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means "Rejoice!" and comes from the entrance antiphon for Mass today: "Rejoice in the Lord always...rejoice...the Lord is near." Today, we light the rose candle, the third on our Advent wreath, and the priests wear rosecolored vestments to remind us that Christ's joyful coming into the world at Christmas is almost here.



The following excerpt from a sermon by Saint Bernard of Clairvau, abbot, (1090-1153) provides rich food for thought on this Third Sunday in Advent:

"We know that there are three comings of the Lord.... In His first coming, our Lord came in our flesh and in our weakness; in [the] middle coming, He comes in spirit and in power; in the final coming, He will be seen in glory and majesty.... In the first, Christ was our redemption; in the last, He will appear as our life; in the middle coming, He is our rest and consolation."

BAMBINELLI SUNDAY

Today, December 12, also is Bambinelli Sunday, instituted by Saint John Paul II (and adopted by his successors) when the children of Rome are encouraged to bring the Baby Jesus (Bambinelli) from their Nativity sets to Saint Peter's Square. After his Sunday Angelus address, the Pope blesses the figures. Following the Holy Father's example, we will bless the Baby Jesus figures from your Nativity sets at our Masses this Sunday, including the 5 p.m. Vigil Mass on Saturday, December 11.

WHAT A BLESSED 40 HOURS!

Thank you to everyone who participated in our annual 40 Hour Devotion **December 6 through 8.** I am confident those hours of quiet time in the presence of our Lord during the night and day brought many blessings and solace to each participant and, through you, to our entire parish.

I hope the experience will encourage you to visit the Basilica for prayer and reflection on a regular basis as our Lord is exposed on the altar for adoration on Wednesdays from 12:45 p.m. (following the 12:10 p.m. Mass) through 8:30 p.m.; and each First Friday of the month from 9 p.m. Friday until 8:20 a.m. on Saturday. Even when the Blessed Sacrament is not exposed on the altar in the monstrance, our Lord is always present in the tabernacle throughout the day and evening, where you can visit Him any time the Basilica is open.

Be sure to join us today, **Sunday**, **December 12**, for our traditional and festive Christmas Tree lighting at 6 p.m. in the Courtyard at 314 Duke Street. Liturgical Calendar This Week

 December 12. Gaudete Sunday, the Third Sunday in Advent. Although it takes place during the usually penitential Advent season, Gaudete Sunday serves as a mid-point break from the austere practices to rejoice in the nearness of Jesus's return. Also Bambellini Sunday, instituted by Pope Saint John Paul II. On this day, children from Rome bring to Saint Peter's Square the figurine of the Christ Child from their family Nativity sets. Then, after his Sunday Angelus address, the Holy Father blesses the Baby Jesus figures.
 December 13. Saint Lucy, Virgin, Martyr. Born c. 304, died in Sicily under Diocletian. Patroness of those afflicted with eye diseases and associated with festivals of light.
 December 14. Saint John of the Cross, Priest, Doctor

of the Church. Mystic and poet, known as the "Mystical Doctor," born in Spain c. 1542. With Saint Teresa of Jesus of Avila, founded the reformed (Discalced) Carmelite friars, now more than 4,000 religious.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: What does it mean to "examine your conscience"?

A: The "examination of the conscience," or the "examen," is a prayerful assessment of your relationship with God – how you have succeeded and how you may have fallen short. Done on a regular basis, it offers a powerful way to reflect on your life and how you have responded to the graces God wants to give to you.

In his *Spiritual Exercises*, Saint Ignatius of Loyola recommends a <u>daily</u> examen to review your relationship with God. This is normally done in the evening, before going to bed, but can be done any time. Saint Ignatius recommends five steps for a good examen:

- 1. THANKSGIVING. Give thanks to God for any benefits you have received.
- 2. **PETITION.** Ask God for the grace to recognize and root out any sins from your life.
- 3. **REVIEW.** Recall times you have fallen into a particular sin or defect.
- 4. **REPENTANCE.** Ask God to pardon your faults.
- 5. **RESOLUTION.** Firmly resolve, with God's grace, to amend your life and avoid committing those faults again.

2016 JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY




In December 2015, Pope Francis designated the coming year, 2016, as a Jubilee Year of Mercy, to close with the end of the liturgical year on the Feast of Christ the King, November 20, 2016. It was a period for Catholics everywhere to focus on God's forgiveness and infinite mercy. According to Church tradition, a Jubilee Year starts by opening the massive Holy Door at the Basilica of Saint Peter in Rome. The Holy Door represents Christ, the Door by which we enter heaven (John 10:7-9). For the Jubilee Year of Mercy, Pope Francis called on each diocese around the world to designate its own "station" or "door" churches. A plenary indulgence could be gained by visiting a station church. Saint Mary, as the oldest parish in the Commonwealth of Virginia, was the first door church on the list for the Arlington Diocese, with Bishop Paul S. Loverde visiting the parish to formally open the Jubilee Year of Mercy.

Throughout 2016, one Sunday each month was designated at the Basilica of Saint Mary as "Mercy Sunday." Worshipers wrote prayer requests on cards, which were placed near the altar and prayed for during the month. Our parishioners visited other station churches in the diocese and many Catholics from around the diocese and neighboring dioceses made Year of Mercy visits to Saint Mary.

On December 12, 2015, the Catholic Daughters of the Americas at Saint Mary celebrated the opening of the Jubilee with a special Mass on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas, complete with a mariachi band to serenade Our Lady and those in attendance. The Basilica's seniors' group, the Saint Anne and Joachim Society, made a Year of Mercy pilgrimage to the National Shrine of Elizabeth Ann Seton in Emmitsburg, MD. In September 2016, Father Edward Hathaway, Basilica rector, led a group of parish pilgrims on a Year of Mercy pilgrimage to the Holy Land and Rome. Father Dan Cambra, of the Marians of the Immaculate Conception, was here at the Basilica to direct a parish-wide Year of Mercy mission. His order is specially entrusted with spreading the message and devotion of Divine Mercy and the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska.
