BASILICA OF SAINT MARY SYNODAL LISTENING SESSION – March 15

In preparation for the 2023 Synod of Bishops in Rome, Pope Francis has asked every local church to undertake their own synodal phase of prayerful listening, dialogue and discernment, focusing on how the Catholic Church is journeying together and fulfilling our mission in the world.

Bishop Michael Burbidge has asked all Arlington Diocese parishes and other diocesan institutions to host their own synodal Listening Sessions. Every person may attend and participate.

WORLD MARRIAGE DAY: Called to the Joy of Love World Marriage Day, the second Sunday of February (February 13 this year), and National Marriage Week USA (February 7 to 14 this year) are observed annually in dioceses throughout our country, focusing on building a culture of life and love that begins with supporting and promoting marriage and the family. The theme for National Marriage Week 2022 is "Called to the Joy of Love."

Marriage in the Church (between a baptized man and a baptized woman) was raised to a Sacrament by Jesus Christ. By this sacrament, He gives to spouses the grace they need to love each other. Their relationship is "caught up into divine love" and "governed and enriched by Christ's redeeming power and the saving activity of the Church" (*Gaudium et Spes*, 48).

This focus on marriage provides all of us with an opportunity to celebrate the precious, God-given covenant between a man and a woman.

THE EUCHARIST: Source and Summit of Our Faith

In the coming months, the Basilica is hosting a series of posters, compiled by the Real Presence Association, Inc., with photos and historical descriptions of the major, Churchapproved Eucharistic Miracles that have occurred around the world. Through the posters, you can "virtually visit" the sites where the miracles took place and learn more about each one. Here at the Basilica, the panels will be displayed, on a rotating basis, through **November 2022**, in the church, Lyceum, Basilica School of Saint Mary and our parish offices.



I encourage you to explore and reflect on these magnificent posters. Each colorful panel will offer you a deeper appreciation and understanding of the Eucharist as the Real Presence of Jesus Christ – Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity – the Source and Summit of our Catholic faith. Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: Why do some of our altar servers wear black and some wear red? How old does a boy need to be to serve as an altar server?

A: Here at the Basilica of Saint Mary, the servers wearing red cassocks (the long garment beneath the white surplice) have received the sacrament of Confirmation. Those wearing black cassocks are younger boys.

Our Basilica altar servers are boys in 5th grade and above. They serve Our Lord at the altar and assist our priests at weekly Masses, funerals, weddings, feast days and various liturgical events throughout the year. Special training is provided before a boy begins serving at the altar.





— February 14: Saint Cyril, Monk, and Saint Methodius, Bishop. Cyril (died in 869) and Methodius (died in 885) were brothers. Known as the "Apostles to the Slavs," they prepared Slavic liturgical texts; served as the "spiritual bridge between Eastern and Western traditions," according to Saint John Paul II.

— February 17: The Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order. The Order of Friar Servants of Mary or Servites (O.S.M.), were founded by seven Florentine cloth merchants in 1233. Today they number about 855 religious. They popularized devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows.

EARLY IESUIT PRIESTS AT SAINT MARY

From 1795 to 1818, Father Francis Ignatius Neale served as pastor at Saint Mary. He was assisted by a number of diocesan and Jesuit priests during his time as pastor. Several had unique and interesting stories.



Father Anthony Kohlman, S.J. (1771-1836), was an Alsatian who had escaped from the French Revolution. Pope Leo XII sent him to Georgetown to teach dogma. While he was administering the Diocese of New York, Father Kohlman built the first Saint Patrick's Cathedral. During his years in New York, Father Kohlman was instrumental in having a penitent-parishioner return stolen property. The court attempted to force the priest to reveal the name of thief. Father Kohlman refused to break the seal of the confessional. The episode attracted much attention in the newspapers. After a number of years in the United States, Father Kohlman returned to Europe and taught theology at the Gregorian College in Rome. Among his students was the future Pope Leo XIII.

Father Enoch Fenwick, S.J. (1780-1827), was a member of one Maryland's prominent families. He was instrumental in building the cathedral in Baltimore. His brother, Benedict Joseph Fenwick, became bishop of Boston. Father Fenwick also served as president of Georgetown College, a position he did not want. According to contemporary testimony, he allowed the prefect of studies, Roger Baxter, to run the college. Young Mr. Baxter was not much of an administrator. He was more interested in being "one of the boys" than in discipline. He declared school holidays whenever he felt in the mood for a day off from classes. As a deacon, Baxter served at Saint Mary; he later returned as pastor here after his ordination.

Giovanni Antonio (John) Grassi, S.J. (1775-1849), was an outstanding scholar and scientist. Before coming to America, the Italian Jesuit was rector of a college in Russian Poland and studied mathematics, astronomy and English. He, too, served as president of Georgetown College. During his tenure there, Father Grassi increased and broadened the college's enrollment, bringing poor Irish students to the school along with the sons of rich planters and Washington politicians. In 1811, he calculated an eclipse of the sun. Father Grassi also spent considerable time as a traveling missionary. - Kitty Guy, Parish Historian
