### MARCH 2: ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday, March 2, is the beginning of Lent, a period of penance and reflection, recalling the 40 days Christ fasted in the desert in preparation for His Passion and death. The ashes we receive on our fore-heads on Ash Wednesday are an outward sign reminding us of our mortality and the need to repent.



Our Masses that day, with distribution of ashes, will be at 6:30 a.m., 8 a.m., 12:10 p.m., 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. (with choir). Confessions will follow the 12:10 p.m. Mass. There also will be Adoration after the 12:10 p.m. Mass until 4:45 p.m.

Ash Wednesday is a day of **fasting** and **abstinence**. Catholics ages 18 through 59 are required to fast, eating only one full meal. Two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal also are permitted, if needed, to sustain energy. Everyone age 14 and older also is required to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday.

MARCH 4: STATIONS & LENTEN SUPPERS BEGIN Friday, March 4, will see the return of two much-loved, family-friendly Lenten traditions at the Basilica: Lenten Suppers and Stations of the Cross. Please join us for both!

**Lenten Suppers** — 6 p.m. in the parish Lyceum (313 Duke Street) on **March 4, 11, 18 and 25, and April 1 and 8**. The suppers will be meatless, except for March 25, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord and a time of celebration! Each Friday's supper will be hosted by one of our wonderful parish Apostolate groups. A free-will donation will support the work of our Saint Vincent de Paul Society.

<u>Stations of the Cross</u> — 7 p.m. in the Basilica on the **Fridays of Lent**, including Friday, April 15 – Good Friday. Also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, the 14 stations prayerfully commemorate specific events of Christ's last day on Earth, following His journey from Pontius Pilate's praetorium to His tomb.

### MARCH 4: PLENARY INDULGENCE

A privilege granted to Saint Mary as a Basilica is a plenary indulgence available to those who devoutly visit the Basilica and participate in any sacred rite (such as Mass or Stations of the Cross) or at least recite the Lord's Prayer here on certain days. One of those days is **Friday**, **March 4**, the anniversary of the dedication of Saint Mary Church by Father Francis Ignatius Neale, S.J., in 1827. To receive the plenary indulgence, the usual conditions apply: Go to confession, receive Holy Communion and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father. These conditions may be carried out within several days (about 20) before or after the indulgenced act.

### MARCH 6: PREMIERE OF OUR NEW CHILDREN'S CHOIR

Our Saint Gregory Children's Choir will sing their first Mass here at the Basilica at **11:30 a.m. on Sunday, March 6**. Under the expert instruction of Director of Music David Elliott, the young singers began their music studies last fall. They now look forward to presenting to the congregation the results of their hard work. As they continue to learn and grow as musicians, the children will sing more frequently at Mass, with the eventual goal of singing once a month. What a blessing it will be to have the Basilica filled with the joyful sounds of singing children!

- March 2. Ash Wednesday. The first day of the penitential season of Lent and a solemn reminder of human mortality and the need for reconciliation with God.

March 3. Saint Katharine Drexel, Virgin. Philadelphia heiress and founder of the Missionary Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. Died March 3, 1955, at age 97. Canonized on October 1, 2000, by Pope Saint John Paul II.

- March 4. Saint Casimir. Polish prince, led an austere life, known as the "brother and defender of the poor." Patron of Poland and Lithuania. Died in 1484.

# Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

## Q: What does it mean to say that the Bible is "inspired" by God?

A: To say that the Bible, or Sacred Scripture, is "inspired" means that God is the primary inspiration behind the human authors. Dei Verbum, the Second Vatican Council's "Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation," affirms this when it states: "The books of the Old and New Testament, whole and entire, with all their parts... (were) written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit ... they have God as their author and have been handed on as such for the Church herself."

The humans who wrote the Sacred Scriptures were not just passive recipients of God's Word who merely served as secretaries for what He was dictating. Rather, as Dei Verbum tells us, God "made use of their powers and abilities," calling them "true authors," even though they "consigned to writing everything and only those things which He wanted."





## From Your Saint Vincent de Paul Society

One of the areas with low-income families located within our parish boundaries is the Duke Street corridor. Rather than driving past these low-rise apartments, take a moment to drive around and see the faces, many belonging to immigrants. These men and women provide so many services to us. They do this for their kids, as other immigrants to our great country

# STATIONS OF THE CROSS

On Fridays during Lent, it is a tradition at the Basilica of Saint Mary and most Catholic churches to pray the Stations of the Cross. This 14-step devotion commemorates the events of Christ's last day on Earth as a man, beginning with His condemnation by Pontius Pilate and ending as He is laid in the tomb. At each Station, prayers are recited as we then move to the next Station until all 14 are completed. The Stations can, of course, be prayed in the Basilica and elsewhere any time, often as a mini-pilgrimage recalling Christ's sacrifice for us.



The Stations here at the Basilica consist of 14 oil paintings on wood panels with mahogany-stained frames. The images are subtly multi-colored with gold leaf accents. Stations I through VII are installed on the north wall of the nave; Stations VIII through XIV are found on the south wall. These Stations date back to extensive renovation of the church in 1857. Pastor at that time was Father Peter Kroes, S.J., a native of Holland. He was the first tenured pastor at Saint Mary and served here until 1872. The Basilica Stations may have been the work of American artist Edward Schuler (1806-1882), noted in an Alexandria Gazette article of July 16, 1857, as a "Fresco Painter." They were restored in 1995. (Adapted from official documents submitted to the Vatican to support designation of Saint Mary as a Basilica.)
