FIRST RECONCILIATION

In May, 102 of our parish second graders will receive their First Holy Communion. An essential step in preparing to receive this Sacrament is First Reconciliation (or Penance or Confession), which will take place for them on **Saturday, February 12**. Please keep these children in your prayers as they personally experience, for the very first time, in the confessional, the infinite mercy of Christ.

You might wonder why such little ones need to go to confession. As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (*CCC*1324) reminds us, the



Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. When we receive Holy Communion, we should be free of serious sin. It is important for a child (or an adult coming into the Church later in life) to receive Holy Communion for the first time with the understanding that through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, our sins are forgiven, preparing us to worthily receive our Lord in the Eucharist. First Penance also helps a young child develop a life-long practice of going to confession on a regular basis.

A Child's Prayer for Forgiveness

O my God, help me to remember the times when I didn't live as Jesus asked me to. Help me to be sorry and to try again. Amen.

OUR LADY OF LOURDES & WORLD DAY OF THE SICK This coming **Friday, February 11**, is the **Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes**. In 1858, the Blessed Mother appeared 18 times to 14-year-old Bernadette Soubirous (Saint Bernadette) near Lourdes, France. Thousands of pilgrims visit the site every year, seeking to be healed by the waters of the grotto where Bernadette encountered Our Lady.

February 11 also is **World Day of the Sick**, instituted by Pope Saint John Paul II in 1992 as "a special time of prayers and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church, and of reminding us to see in our sick brothers and sisters the face of Christ." Saint John Paul had been diagnosed with Parkinson's the previous year. Then, in 2013, Pope Benedict XVI chose to announce his resignation on February 11, citing his failing health as the reason for that decision.

This year, we especially continue to pray for all those affected by the pandemic, their medical and family caregivers, those seeking ways to prevent and treat the disease, and those whose livelihoods have been affected by it. We also pray for healing of the spiritual, political, racial and economic wounds continuing to afflict our nation and our world.

Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us!

Liturgical Calendar This Week

—February 8: Saint Jerome Emiliani. Venetian soldier and convert; founder (1534) of the Clerks Regular of Somascha, dedicated to the poor and educating youth. Saint Josephine Bakhita, Virgin. Born c. 1869 in Sudan. Raised in the Islamic faith; kidnapped as a child by slave traders; purchased by the Italian Consul and sent to live with the Canossian Sisters in Venice. Granted her freedom and joined that order, serving 50 years as cook, seamstress and portress. Died in 1947.

- February 10: Saint Scholastica, Virgin. Died c. 543. Twin of Saint Benedict; interred in the same grave with him at the monastery he established at Monte Cassino, Italy. Her aid is invoked against storms.

—**February 11: Our Lady of Lourdes.** Commemorates the 1858 appearance of Our Lady to Saint Bernadette at Lourdes, when Mary called herself "The Immaculate Conception." Patroness of the sick.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: What are the Precepts of the Catholic Church?

A: The laws, or Precepts, of the Church, are the "very necessary minimum" requirements for Catholics to express their commitment to Christ through participation in the life of the Church He founded. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* describes them as "set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life" (*CCC* 2041). They are:

- You shall attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligations, and rest from servile labor on those days.
- You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
- You shall receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist (Holy Communion) at least during the Easter season.
- You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
- You shall help provide for the needs of the Church.





FUNERALS – A CENTURY AGO

In the horse-and-buggy days, before automobiles became common, transporting a coffin and the mourners to church and the cemetery could involve unforeseen complications. The funeral of Mr. Thomas Monroe, the father of Saint Mary's organist, suffered an unexpected mishap.



19th-century hearse

According to the local newspaper: "12 November 1891. As the handsome black, decorated, horse-drawn hearse from Wheatley's undertaker, on King Street, was on its way to 412 S. Pitt Street to pick up the body of the late Thomas Monroe and carry it to Saint Mary Church for his funeral service, a horse belonging to Mr. Robert Elliott, and attached to his wagon, became frightened. The spooked horse ran off and collided with the hearse at the intersection of Duke and St. Asaph Streets, upsetting it, breaking off one of its wheels and causing other damage." The story did not tell what happened next. How did they transport Mr. Monroe the two blocks from his house to the church? Use a substitute hearse? Someone's wagon or carriage? Or did the pallbearers have to carry him? Hopefully, they did not have to carry him all the way down Royal Street to the cemetery!

Less than two years later, a similar accident happened enroute to the funeral of Mr. Frank Blair, also reported in the newspaper: "25 March 1893. The funeral of Mr. Frank Blair, a well-known colored [sic] citizen, took place from St. Mary's Church. While the carriages were moving up Royal Street, a horse attached to one of them fell and caused much alarm among the occupants of the vehicle." The paper did not say whether any of the mourners were injured, or if the horse survived. The Blair family were well-respected residents of Old Town Alexandria, and included Mr. Thomas Blair, the sexton at Saint Mary Cemetery for decades and a founder of Saint Joseph Parish.

Recently, horse-drawn hearses have regained popularity. Not long ago, one was used for the burial of a member of the Day family in Saint Mary Cemetery. The mourners, however, traveled to the cemetery by car.
