## STILL MARCHING FOR LIFE

**Saturday, January 22,** is the 49th anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*, the 1973 U.S. Supreme Court decision legalizing abortion in this country. According to the National Right to Life Committee, more than 62.5 million babies have been lost through legalized abortion since 1973. We clearly must continue to advocate and pray for an end to this tragedy. As Saint Teresa of Calcutta warned, "A nation that kills its children in the womb has lost its soul."

Each year, for nearly five decades, pro-life advocates from around the nation have gathered in Washington, DC, to march from the National Mall to Capitol Hill and the steps of the Supreme Court, seeking a reversal of *Roe v. Wade*. March for Life 2022 takes place on Friday, January 21.



As in past years, the Basilica of Saint Mary is hosting groups from outside our area who will stay here or use our facilities for March-related activities. Included this year are: Catalyst Catholic, a youth ministry group from New Albany, IN, and a group from Franciscan University in Steubenville, OH, led by their president, Fr. Dave Pivonka, TOR. We'll also be hosting 40 high schoolers and 10 adults from the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana, the home diocese of Fr. Andrew Thornton, who was with us at the Basilica during his seminary studies.

One focus for the March this year will be the Supreme Court's response to *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*. The case addresses the constitutionality of elective abortions after 15 weeks' gestation. The Court heard oral arguments in the case late last year and is expected to issue a decision in the coming months. The ruling could be the first step in an incremental weakening of *Roe v. Wade*. We pray for a pro-life outcome!

## Liturgical Calendar This Week

January 17: Saint Anthony of Egypt, Abbot. Died in 356 at the age of 105. Born in upper Egypt; hermit and early founder of religious life. Called the "Patriarch of Monks"; aided St. Athanasius of Alexandria in combating the Arian heresy that denied the divinity of Christ.

January 20: Saint Fabian, Pope, Martyr. Layman elected bishop of Rome in 236. Martyred in 250. Saint Sebastian, Martyr. Martyred around 288 under Diocletian — pierced by arrows and then clubbed to death. Patron of archers, soldiers and police associations.

January 21: Saint Agnes, Virgin, Martyr. Martyred in the early 4th century at the age of 12 (according to Saints Augustine and Ambrose). Patroness of Christian virtue confronted by political and social violence. Represented with a martyr's palm and a lamb (her name in Latin means lamb).

# Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

## Q: Why does the priest kiss the altar at Mass?

A: The kiss is an act of reverence. The altar represents our Lord, who as we pray in Preface of Easter V "showed Himself to be the priest, the altar and the lamb of sacrifice." Moreover, relics of the saints traditionally are placed in the altar, which themselves make an altar worthy of such veneration.

(NOTE: Here at the Basilica of Saint Mary, there is no record telling us which saints' relics are embedded in our altar. That information is simply lost to history.)







# THE LAWLER FAMILY

The Lawlers are a good example of the very successful Irish immigrant families who settled in Alexandria. Edmund Lawler (1818-1883) and his wife, Mary, came from County Kilkenny around 1849. He worked as a milkman in Alexandria. Their son, Martin (1837-1916), was 12 years old when his family came to America. Martin first worked at Smith and Perkins locomotive works in the 1850s. Later, he worked at Thomas Jamieson's machine shop at the southwest corner of Pitt ad Gibbon Streets. After the Civil War, he entered the grocery business. His store, located at the corner of Pitt and Gibbon, was very successful. In 1903, Martin bought the large, red brick Queen Anne house at 517 South Washington Street that has become somewhat of a landmark in Old Town Alexandria today.




Nicholas Lawler, Martin's son (1877-1940) went into the wholesale gas business. He served on the Alexandria City Council and was an active member of Saint Mary Church. After the 1929 fire that badly damaged the church, major repairs and renovations were needed. At that time, the marble tabernacle is use today replaced an older one. Nicholas Lawler and his sister, Ella Lawler Ryan, donated the "safe" (locked interior) of the tabernacle in use today and its golden revolving door, in memory of their parents. A brass plaque on the pediment over



the current tabernacle bears the dedication to Martin and Mary Lawler. The family also donated the Saint Mary's ornate gold monstrance in memory of their brother Neale Lawler.

Nicholas and Annie Fleming Lawler's daughter, Margaret, lived in the large house on Washington Street until the 1970s. Margaret, too, was an active and devout member of the parish. When she died in 2013, she bequeathed a very large amount of money to Saint Mary, to be used for the cemetery. Her generous gift was used to erect the marble altar on the South Royal edge of the cemetery, used for Mass on Memorial Day and exposition during the parish Corpus Christi procession. - Kitty Guy, Parish Historian
