FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD & CHALKING OUR DOORS

Sunday, January 2, is the **Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord**, one of the oldest of all Christian feasts. Also known as Three Kings' Day, it commemorates the visit of the Magi to the Christ Child.

Marking our doorways or front porch steps with blessed chalk is a centuries-old Epiphany custom and a fun, visible way to dedicate our homes and the New Year to God. The inscription this year is:



20 + C + M + B + 22

"20" and "22" stand for the new year (2022), of course. The plus signs represent the Cross. CMB are the first initials of the traditional names given to the Magi — Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. They also abbreviate the Latin *Christus mansionem benedicat*, or "May Christ bless the house."

To mark your home, you will need two things: Chalk that has been blessed by a priest and a prayer. We have small bags of blessed chalk for you at the back of the Basilica this weekend so you can "chalk" your home! As you prepare to mark the front door or porch, say the following:

The Three Wise Men, Casper, Melchior and Balthasar, followed the star of God's Son who became human two thousand and twenty-two years ago. May Christ bless our home and be with us throughout the New Year. Amen.

Then, as you make the marks, offer the following prayer:

Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of Your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of Your love. Grant that we may manifest Your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of You. Guide, comfort and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen.

HELPING THE BISHOPS PREPARE FOR 2023 SYNOD

Pope Francis has invited Catholics throughout the world to help prepare for the next Synod of Bishops to be held in Rome in **October 2023**. A Synod, from the Greek word "to journey together," is a gathering of bishops called by the Holy Father to reflect and offer counsel on important pastoral matters in the life of the Church. The theme for the 2023 Synod is: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission." In preparation for that gathering, the Holy Father has asked every Catholic diocese to undertake its own synodal review and discussions.

To that end, Arlington Bishop Michael Burbidge has asked that in-person Listening Sessions be held this spring, February through April, at the local level — in parishes, at universities and schools, at Catholic Charities and at other locations. He adds, "We will also reach out to include those who are no longer active in the faith, and those on the margins of the Church and society, that we may understand what distances them from the Church and how we might accompany them." The Diocese will collect the results of these sessions and draft a report to submit to the Holy See.

Liturgical Calendar This Week

- **January 3: The Most Holy Name of Jesus.** Celebrated in the Church, at least at local levels, since the late 15th century. Commemorates the naming of the child Jesus. Devotion to the Holy Name was promoted by Saint Bernardine of Siena
- January 4: Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, Religious. Raised Episcopalian; wife, mother of five children. Founded (1812) the Sisters of Charity, first congregation for women religious in the United States, devoted to educating the poor and teaching in parochial schools. First native-born U.S. citizen to be canonized (1975).
- **January 5: Saint John Neumann, Bishop.** Missionary to the United States from Bohemia; became bishop of Philadelphia. Promoter of parochial schools. First U.S. bishop to be canonized (1977).
- January 6: Saint Andre Bessette, Religious. Died January 6, 1937, at age 91. A healer and the "Miracle Man of Montreal," where he founded the Oratory of Saint Joseph. More than one million people paid their respects at his death.
- January 7: Saint Raymond of Penafort, Priest. Died in 1275 at age 99. Second master general of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans) after Saint Dominic. Collator of canon law. Patron of canonists and lawyers.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: Is it OK for a Catholic to receive communion at a Protestant church service?

A: No, it isn't. Protestant denominations do not share our Catholic belief that the Eucharist truly IS the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. In most Protestant services, the communion wine and wafer are only symbols representing Christ and His ultimate Sacrifice. Catholics believe that the Sacred Host and Precious Blood, when consecrated by the priest, actually become the Body and Blood of Christ.

According to the Code of Canon Law (844), "Catholic ministers [priest, deacon or validly commissioned Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion] may licitly administer the sacraments to Catholic members of the Christian faithful only and, likewise, the latter may licitly receive the sacraments only from Catholic ministers." The key term here is "licit." If a Catholic receives communion from a Protestant minister, it is generally considered "illicit" or unlawful.

In addition, when one receives communion, they are making a statement that they are in communion with that particular community and all of their beliefs. Therefore, it would be a scandal for a Catholic to make such a statement in a Protestant church.







FROM THE ARCHIVES of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish since its founding in 1795


A periodic look at the history



FATHER JOSEPH FINOTTI

Priests of the Society of Jesus, or Jesuits, were the backbone of the early Saint Mary parish, serving as pastors and parochial vicars here for many decades. One of the most interesting Jesuits to serve as pastor of both Saint Mary parish and its nearby mission church, Saint Ignatius of Loyola Church in Oxon Hill, MD, was Father Joseph Finotti.

Born in Ferrara, Italy, in 1817, he was described as an "independent, bright and somewhat eccentric child." After running away from his family, he reconciled with them and entered the Society of Jesus in Rome at age 16. His brother, Augustavo Adolfo Finotti, was a Papal Count and Consul of the Pope in Boston. Through his brother's influence, Father Joseph Finotti joined the Maryland Province of the Jesuits. In 1849, while living in Alexandria and serving at Saint Mary, he also was given charge of the "railroad mission" in Fairfax Station. When he was made pastor of Saint Ignatius in Oxon Hill, he remained at Saint Mary and ferried across the Potomac to serve his new church on the Maryland side of the river.



Father Finotti was so well liked that, when the bishop eventually moved him from Saint Mary and Saint Ignatius, a large number of parishioners approached the Jesuit Provincial to ask that he remain with them. But to their great disappointment, the bishop could not be persuaded to reverse his decision.

Father Finotti subsequently became editor of the Boston Pilot, a leading 19th-century Catholic newspaper. During his years as editor, he also was pastor of two Boson-area churches. Due to ill health, he moved to Colorado in 1877, where he compiled a remarkable anthology of the published works of Catholic writers in America from 1784-1824. His work laid the foundation for subsequent Catholic historians. He was pastor of the Catholic church in Central City, CO, a mining town, from 1877 until his death in 1879.
