

## THE HOLY NAME OF JESUS

**January** is the month of the Holy Name of Jesus. Over the centuries, a number of remarkable saints have promoted devotion to the Holy Name. Saint Bernard of Clairvaux begged that it be lovingly kept in everyone's heart and reverently uttered on everyone's lips. Saint Bernardine of Siena carried the Holy Name of Jesus on a banner through the streets of Rome.



Saint John of Capistrano won a battle against the Turks in 1456 by commanding his soldiers to repeat the Holy Name of Jesus with adoration and reverence. The Jesuit Order, founded by Saint Ignatius of Loyola, has its feast on January 1, the day Mary's Divine Child received His Holy Name. This month, and always, let us pray for sincere respect for this greatest of all names and make reparation for offenses to it, especially in the entertainment industry.

## PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

For more than 100 years, Christians around the world have joined in a **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity**, **January 18 to 25** this year. The 2022 theme, "We saw the star in the East, and we came to worship Him" (Matthew 2:2), was selected by the Middle East Council of Churches and originates from the churches in Lebanon. Current times in Lebanon are extremely difficult and economically disastrous, exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. The power of our prayer in solidarity with those suffering in Lebanon, and elsewhere, is a sincere demonstration of Christian unity and a sign of communion.

#### **THE CONVERSION OF SAINT PAUL – JANUARY 25**

At daily Mass on **Tuesday, January 25**, we read the story of the conversion of Saul/Saint Paul the Apostle. The event led him to cease persecuting early Christians and become a follower of Jesus. It launched his life as a tireless missionary. The Responsorial Psalm on Tuesday repeats Christ's words: "Go out to all the world and tell the Good News" (Mark 16:15). This was Paul's vocation but it is also the vocation of the whole Church and each one of us.

To that end, **today, Sunday, January 23**, we launch our new Institute for Faith & Public Culture at the Basilica of Saint Mary, created to reach out as a beacon of life, light and faith in our community. The Institute's inaugural event is a lecture by Dr. Chad Pecknold, the Institute's Resident Theologian, entitled "Sacred Fire: How the Church's Faith Became Integral to the Ancient City, and Can Become So Again!" We will begin with a reception at 6 p.m., followed by the lecture at 6:30 p.m., both in the parish Lyceum auditorium at 313 Duke Street. ## Liturgical Calendar This Week

— January 24: Saint Francis de Sales, Bishop, Doctor of the Church. Died in 1622. Bishop of Geneva. Sought to bring many back to the church through his personal life, sermons and writings, including his famous *Introduction to the Devout Life*. Co-founder with Saint Jane Frances de Chantal of the Visitation Order; patron of writers, journalists and the deaf.

— January 25: The Conversion of Saint Paul the Apostle. Commemorates the conversion of Paul, a Pharisee, who became the "Apostle of the Gentiles."

— January 26: Saints Timothy and Titus, Bishops. Timothy, from Lystra in Asia Minor, and Titus, of Greek origin, were 1st century companions of Saint Paul. Overseers of the churches of Ephesus and Crete, respectively. Recipients of the so-called pastoral epistles.

— January 27: Saint Angela Merici, Virgin. Founded the Company of Saint Ursula, 1535, in Brescia, Italy, to educate girls. Later came the Order of Ursulines, with sites of learning worldwide, most notably in North America.

— January 28: Saint Thomas Aquinas, Priest, Doctor of the Church. Died in 1274; Order of Preachers. The "Angelic Doctor" who wrote the *Summa Theologiae*, the *Adoro te devote*, *O salutaris*, *Tantum ergo* and *Pange* lingua. Patron of Catholic schools, colleges and universities.

# Q: Why does the priest drop a piece of the consecrated Host into the chalice during the Lamb of God?

A: At that moment in the Mass, the priest breaks off a tiny piece of the Sacred Host and drops it into the chalice. He prays, "May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it."

This action represents the unity of the Sacrament: The Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus is truly and fully present in both the Precious Blood in the Chalice and the Sacred Host on the paten.



# A periodic look at the history



# SAINT MARY'S STAINED **GLASS WINDOWS.** Part 4

Continuing our look at the large stained glass windows in the Basilica nave (main section), we find two beautiful depictions of saints on the north wall, on your left as you face the statue of Saint Joseph in the sanctuary.



Saint Vincent de Paul and Saint Michael the Archangel. The window depicting Saint Vincent de Paul (1580-1660), Patron Saint of the Poor, was donated by the family of Michael A. Ahern, son of Irish immigrants and well-known Alexandria businessman and philanthropist. During the Spanish Influenza epidemic of 1918, Ahern was the largest contributor to a fundraising drive to help indigent citizens pay for hospital bills or burial costs. He was an active member of the parish Saint Vincent de Paul Society and left most of his estate to the Society and other charities. His former grocery store at the corner of Prince and West Streets is today

Christ House and the Catholic Charities clothing store. The Saint Michael half of the window reflects the fact that Ahern's baptismal name was Michael. The archangel is holding a sword with a flame, representing his role as our protector against the "wickedness and snares of the devil."

Saint Bridget and Saint Patrick. These two well-known Irish saints (both lived circa 400-500 AD), are depicted in

this prominent location in the center of the nave. Saint Patrick converted the Irish to Christianity; Saint Bridget founded a convent so many young girls could become nuns. This window was given to our parish church by the family of Denis and Ellen Buttimore, Irish immigrants from County Cork. The 1880 Alexandria city directory lists Denis Buttimore as a laborer, living at 112 North Patrick Street. In 1895, he is listed as a watchman. He died in 1897. — Adapted from official documents submitted to the Vatican to support the designation of Saint Mary as a Basilica
