SUMMER IS HERE: Dress for A/C

One of the basic, precious tenets of our Catholic faith is the privilege and obligation of participating in Mass every Sunday (or Saturday evening Vigil) and Holy Days of Obligation. That applies whenever a church is geographically accessible, even when we are on vacation. If you are traveling this summer, please visit MassTimes.org for locations and schedules of Masses throughout the United States.

Wherever you attend Mass in these days of summer, or any time during the year, please remember that what is acceptable for recreational wear is not always appropriate for the House of God, where we truly encounter and receive Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Our historic Basilica of Saint Mary is fully air-conditioned so everyone can be comfortable and dressed appropriately, modestly and respectfully for sacred worship.



Just a few reminders to help us be active, reverently engaged participants in the sacred liturgy:

- Please arrive for Mass on time. (Pope Francis suggests arriving at least 10 minutes early to quietly, prayerfully prepare for Mass and reception of the Holy Eucharist.) If you arrive late, please wait for an appropriate break in the Mass (such as after the Responsorial Psalm or Alleluia) before finding a seat. And please enter a pew from a side aisle rather than the center aisle.
- Please turn off or mute cell phones and all other electronic devices so as not to disturb others or detract from the solemnity of the Mass.
- Be mindful and respectful of the Blessed Sacrament reposed in the Tabernacle and those people who are praying in the Basilica before or after Mass by waiting until you get outside to socialize and catch up with friends.
- Food and beverages are never permitted in the Basilica. Exceptions are water or a bottle for baby. But please no cookies, crackers or other crunchy, crumbly foods!

Liturgical Calendar This Week

July 11. Saint Benedict, Abbot. The Patriarch of Western Monasticism, he wrote a famous monastic Rule noted for its wisdom, moderation and need for obedience. Founded 12 monasteries, including Monte Cassino. Benedictines today number some 6,970. Patron of Europe. Died in 547.

<u>July 13. Saint Henry.</u> Died in 1024. With his wife, Saint Cunegunda, aided the poor; as emperor, respected the Church's freedom, fostering ecclesiastical and monastic reform.

July 14. Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, Virgin. Died in 1680 at Caughnawaga, Quebec, at age 24. Led a life of great austerity and love despite ridicule and abuse; called "Lily of the Mohawks"; first Native American to be declared Blessed(1980); canonized by Pope Benedict XVI, October 21, 2012.

July 15. Saint Bonaventure, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. Franciscan (Order of Friars Minor, OFM), minister general for 17 years. Cardinal bishop of Albano; authored biblical commentaries and many ascetical and spiritual treatises. Known as the "Seraphic Doctor." Died in 1274.

July 16. Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This title is given to the Blessed Virgin Mary for her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order. Since the 15th century, popular devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel has centered on the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, also known as the Brown Scapular. Mary is said to have given it to an early Carmelite priest, Saint Simon Stock.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: Is there a limit on the number of Masses a priest can celebrate in one day?

A. Yes. For centuries the church has regulated that number, primarily to ensure that the Eucharist is celebrated with the dignity and devotion it deserves.

In general, a priest may celebrate up to two Masses on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation and one Mass on other days. There are exceptions. The Code of Canon Law (#505.2) says "if there is a shortage of priests, the local ordinary [bishop] can allow priests to celebrate twice a day for a just cause, or if pastoral necessity requires it, even three times on Sundays and holy days of obligation."

In many dioceses, bishops have given their priests blanket permission to invoke this "twice on weekdays, three times on Sunday" option. For genuine pastoral emergencies, a bishop is empowered to grant a dispensation even beyond the "three-Mass limit" — such as where a sudden sickness and lack of a substitute priest might compromise the need of the faithful for the Eucharist.



With the expiration of COVID-related moratoriums on evictions and utilities cutoffs, coupled with the end of federally funded rental assistance administered by our state government, we have entered an unprecedented period of

OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL & THE BROWN SCAPULAR

Saturday, July 16, is the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. We will honor Mary under this title at our 8:30 a.m. Mass at the Basilica of Saint Mary, with an opportunity to receive and be enrolled in the Brown Scapular. The Scapular consists of two small pieces of cloth joined by strings and worn over the shoulders. It is an outward sign of interior consecration to Our Lady.



According to tradition, the Blessed Virgin Mary gave the scapular as a sign of salvation to Saint Simon Stock, a Carmelite priest, in 1251. "Those who die wearing this scapular shall not suffer eternal fire," she promised. "Wear it devoutly and perseveringly. It is my garment. To be clothed in it means you are continually thinking of me and I, in turn, am always thinking of you and helping you to secure eternal life." For centuries, this Scapular has been one of the most popular of all Marian Devotions, second only to Our Lady's Rosary. The late Bishop Fulton Sheen said, "The Scapular bears a double witness: to Mary's protection against the ravages of the flesh occasioned by the fall, and to Mary's influence as Mediatrix of Graces, who covers our souls with the richness of her Son's Redemption."

If you have been enrolled in the Brown Scapular in the past, you are enrolled for life but please join us on Saturdayto renew your own relationship with Our Lady.

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish since its founding in 1795



THE 1995 BICENTENNIAL

A unique, major event during Father Stanley Krempa's years as pastor at Saint Mary (1991-1999) was the parish bicentennial in 1995. Father Krempa and the planning committee worked for more than two years to make this parish milestone memorable.



Cardinal Keeler

A special 200th anniversary Mass and banquet were the culmination of a number of other social and spiritual events throughout 1995. The Bicentennial Mass was offered on October 5, 1995. Presiding was Cardinal William Keeler, Archbishop of Baltimore, with Arlington Bishop John R. Keating as the main celebrant. Cardinal Keeler joked that he had two roles to play at the celebration: To "decorate" the sanctuary and, more importantly, to speak about Baltimore and its historic relationship to the founding of Saint Mary parish.

Vested concelebrant Monsignor Frank J. Hendrick, previous pastor of Saint Mary (1981-1991), was the homilist for the Mass. He emphasized the strong Jesuit influence in the first 100 years of the parish, and even farther back, to Jesuit Archbishop John Carroll and his relationship to the Brent family of Aquia, Virginia. The Brents were Virginia's first Catholic family. Aquia, in Stafford County, was originally part of Saint Mary's extensive parish.

At the conclusion of the Mass, Bishop Keating acknowledged Saint Mary's oldest parishioner, 102-year-old Miss Lena Moore, a faithful and lifelong parishioner and volunteer. He also recognized Mrs. Naomi Theresa Thomas, 89, who had been a parishioner of Saint Mary in the early 1900s and was one of the first parishioners of Saint Joseph Church when it was founded in Alexandria in 1914 to serve the area's black Catholics.

In his own remarks, Father Krempa stated: "Clearly, after 200 years, Saint Mary's energy is not spent but ready for the next century!" - Kitty Guy, Parish Historian


