

WELCOME TO OUR NEW BASILICA SCHOOL OF SAINT MARY PRINCIPAL

I am delighted to announce good news regarding The Basilica School of Saint Mary. Mr. Robert Loia will be joining our school community as principal, beginning **Monday, July 18, 2022**. This is a wonderful blessing! I am grateful for the nationwide search conducted by members of the Principal Search Committee – including our chair, Father David Dufresne; Mary Costello; Aimee Viana; Paul Scolese; Trish Weiler; Breigh Finnerty; Diane Elliott; and Hilary Munger.

The committee was unanimous in recommending Mr. Loia to me. After interviewing him, I am confident he is highly qualified by his deep Catholic faith, education and experience to advance our parish school on all levels for the benefit of our students, school families, faculty, staff and the greater Saint Mary parish community.

I want to share with you excerpts from Mr. Loia's introductory note so you can take heart in his leadership intentions and better understand the exemplary, diverse professional experience, skills and personal spiritual formation he will share with us, as well as have a glimpse into his family life:

"It is a tremendous honor for me to assume the role of principal of The Basilica School of Saint Mary... As principal I tend to be mission driven, and to draw on my many years in Catholic education as a student, a teacher and an administrator. I want all of our students to receive the strongest formation of intellect and character, of mind and spirit, whether in the classroom, on the stage, on the field or in our co-curricular activities. I look forward to being present and getting to know this community well, as I lead us in the common work of forming our children.



"I am a native of New Jersey. My parents both immigrated from Italy and made sure to send us to Catholic elementary school. I attended a Catholic, all-boy school in Northern New Jersey run by a community of Benedictine monks and then continued to attend Catholic school for my undergraduate and graduate studies (Catholic University, Loyola University of Maryland and the University of Notre Dame).

"My wife, Betty (Mary Elizabeth), and I lived the first 10 years of our marriage in Baltimore, where I taught at Loyola Blakefield (grades 6-12) with a brief time as head of the Middle School at Saint Anselm's Abbey School (grades 6-12) in Northeast DC. We then returned to my hometown in New Jersey for 10 years, where I was a guidance counselor, teacher and coach at Delbarton School, the all-boy high school I attended. Following that, I was headmaster at Subiaco Academy (grades 7-12) in Arkansas, returned to New Jersey to be principal of Morris Catholic High School and then moved to Cardinal Newman School in Columbia, South Carolina (grades 7-12).

"We have six children. The oldest is 29 and youngest is 17 (four boys and two girls). Betty is also a Catholic school teacher. She has taught reading, social studies, and religion for students from grades 4-7. In addition ... she worked for the Archdiocese of New York in their Family Life Office, where she conducted marriage preparation programs."

Liturgical Calendar This Week

July 18. Saint Camillus de Lellis, Priest. Suffered a troubled adolescence and became addicted to gambling. Obtained work with the Capuchins and was converted. Founded (1582) the Camillians, a religious society that established hospitals and cared for the sick. Patron of nurses, the sick and hospitals.

July 20. Saint Apollinaris, Bishop and Martyr. Early accounts say he was ordained bishop by Saint Peter and sent as a missionary bishop to Ravenna in the reign (41-54 AD) of Emperor Claudius. Renowned for his power to heal in the name of Jesus Christ; exiled, tortured, imprisoned and martyred for the faith.

July 21. Saint Lawrence of Brindisi, Priest and Doctor of the Church. Capuchin, linguist, military chaplain, diplomat and minister general. He loved the Eucharist and his Masses frequently lasted for several hours. Died in 1619. July 22. Saint Mary Magdalene. 1st century. Healed of possession; disciple of Jesus and present at His crucifixion. In Mark, the first to witness to the risen Lord, hence called the "Apostle of the Apostles." Almost universally agreed today that her being identified as the sinful woman of Lk 7:36-50 is unfounded. Patroness of the Order of Preachers. July 23. Saint Bridget, Religious. Died in 1373 in Rome. Born in Sweden, mother of eight. Mystic, prophet, founded the Order of the Most Holy Savior (Bridgetines). Patroness of Sweden. With Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) and Saint Catherine of Siena, declared copatroness of Europe by Pope Saint John Paul II in 1999.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

In preparation for its 50th anniversary, our Arlington Diocese is marking this year with the theme: "Remember," reflecting on the Eucharist and Christ's words during the Last Supper: "Do this in remembrance of me." An article in the *Arlington Catholic Herald* (June 30-July 13, 2022), "The Eucharist Explained," explores various aspects of Holy Communion, incorporating information from Matthew Tsakanikas, a theology professor at Christendom College. Following is an excerpt from that article:

Q: How should Catholics prepare to receive Communion?

A: The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (*CCC* 1415) says people should prepare body and soul for a worthy reception of the Eucharist. One's demeanor and clothes should convey respect, solemnity and the joy of the moment.

Anyone receiving Communion should fast at least an hour from food and drink, except for water and medicine. Anyone who is conscious of having committed a grave sin should receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation [Confession] before coming to Communion. Saint Paul says in 1 Corinthians 11:27: "Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord."During Mass, a full and active participation in the liturgy is the best way to prepare to receive Holy Communion, said Tsakanikas.

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish since its founding in 1795

SAINT ANTHONY MISSION

Saint Mary Pastor Father Louis Smet established Saint Anthony Mission, located on Leesburg Pike (Route 7) near Bailey's Crossroads, in 1920. At the time, the Virginia Episcopal Theological Seminary in Alexandria owned a plot of land in that location they no longer needed. The seminary graciously donated the land to the Diocese of Richmond, as long as it was used for a church.

A small wooden chapel was erected on the land, Saint Anthony's first church. On June 12, 1920, the first Mass was celebrated in the little mission. The altar was donated by the Catholic Extension Society. Mass was offered twice a month. In winter, the first parishioner to arrive would build a fire in the small stove. Parishioners also planted shade trees to provide some relief from the summer heat. Today, the trees are so large that they shade the entire front of the church. Priests of Saint Mary served the mission until the late 1930s, when it was transferred to Saint Mary of Sorrows at Fairfax Station, and, after World War II, to Blessed Sacrament in Fairlington.



In 1954, the land was deeded back to the Episcopalian seminary when the property had become too small for the needs of the Catholic parish. Monsignor Justin McClunn expressed his appreciation for the seminary's generosity for the 34 years Saint Anthony had the use of the property. The old frame building on the land was later sold to the Romanian Orthodox Church, which still uses it. A new church and school were built in 1953. Saint Anthony now has a lovely, modern church and school. -Kitty Guy, Parish Historian
