Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: Monastery, convent, friary....what's the difference?

A: A <u>monastery</u> (from the Greek *monzein*, to live alone) is a place where religious men (monks) or women (nuns) live in seclusion. Theirs is a cloistered, contemplative life of work and prayer, mostly in silence and with very limited access to the outside world. How cloistered the group is depends on the religious order or community and the intent of the founder who started it. Here in Alexandria, strictly cloistered Poor Clare nuns live at Mary, Mother of the Church Monastery, near Saint Louis Church.

A <u>convent</u> is generally home to religious women who are not cloistered and are more involved with the outside, secular world. The word convent comes from the Latin *conventus* meaning assembly. (Women who live in convents are technically known as "sisters" rather than "nuns.") The sisters typically live and pray together in the convent but work outside in schools, hospitals, etc. For example, the Daughters of Saint Paul who operate the Pauline Books and Media Center here in Old Town Alexandria live in a convent.

A <u>friary</u> (from the Latin *frater*, meaning brother) is generally the male version of the convent. It provides a place where religious men (brothers and priests) live, work and pray together.



FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish

A periodic look at the history since its founding in 1795.



MONSIGNOR STEPHENS' HEARING AIDS!



Monsignor Edward L. Stephens, pastor at Saint Mary from 1943 to 1959, did not believe the parish needed a large number of different social organizations. When his young assistant priests would suggest an organization he did not want to bother with, the good Monsignor pretended he could not hear them, fiddled with his hearing aids and repeatedly asked, "What did you say?" The younger priests presumed "the boss" didn't hear them and eventually gave up. Monsignor Stephens told his colleagues it took the assistants at least a year to catch on to his trickery.

But he was outsmarted one time. In 1958, an elderly parishioner went over the pastor's head and wrote to Pope John XXIII to complain there were no activities in the parish for older people. The Vatican Secretary of State sent the request on to Monsignor Stephens, who obligingly organized the parish Golden Age Club!

SEEKING REPARATION FOR RACISM

The Saint Katharine Drexel Society, a Saint Mary parish apostolate, prays for the healing of our nation, especially for the historical and continuing wounds inflicted by slavery, and in reparation for the sins of racism, past and present. The group prays the rosary during the Basilica Holy Hour on Wednesdays from 7:30 to 8:30 p.m. and meets at other times for prayer and fellowship. Father David serves as chaplain. The patroness of the society, Saint Katharine Drexel (1858-1955), was the second Americanborn saint canonized by the Catholic Church. Born in Philadelphia to a wealthy family, she entered religious life

Saints on the Calendar This Week

July 20. Saint Apollinaris, Bishop and Martyr. 1st century. Early accounts report he was ordained bishop by Saint Peter himself and sent as a missionary bishop to Ravenna, Italy, in the reign (41-54 AD) of the emperor Claudius. Renowned for his power to heal in the name of Christ; exiled, tortured, imprisoned and ultimately martyred for the faith.

July 21. Saint Lawrence of Brindisi, Priest and Doctor of the Church. Capuchin friar, linguist, military chaplain, diplomat and minister general. Fifteen volumes of his writings are extant. Died in 1619.

July 22. Saint Mary Magdalene. 1st century. Healed of possession; disciple of Jesus and present at His crucifixion. In Mark, the first to witness to the risen Lord, hence called the "Apostle of the Apostles." Almost universally agreed today that her being identified as the sinful woman of Lk 7:36-50 is unfounded. Patroness of the Order of Preachers.

July 23. Saint Bridget, Religious. Died in 1373 in Rome. Born in Sweden, mother of eight. Mystic, prophet, founded the Order of the Most Holy Savior ("Bridgetines"). Sought to end the luxury and dissipation of the Avignon papacy and returning the pope to Rome. Patroness of Sweden. With Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) and Saint Catherine of Siena, declared co-patroness of Europe by Pope Saint John Paul II in 1999.

July 24. Saint Sharbel Makhluf, Priest. Born in 1828 in a small mountain village in north Lebanon; became a Maronite rite monk; ordained a priest in 1859. Devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary; spent his last 23 years as a hermit. Taught the value of poverty, self-sacrifice and prayer by the life he lived. Possessed the gift of performing miracles even during his lifetime. Died in 1898. Canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1977. Known as the "Hermit of Lebanon."
