TWO THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT JULY 25, 2021..... World Day for Grandparents & the Elderly!

Pope Francis recently announced a new World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly to honor all grandparents and the elderly, people who are so vital to our parish communities and our Church. It is to be celebrated every year on the fourth Sunday in July, as close as possible to the July 26 Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and grandparents of Jesus. So, today, **Sunday**, **July 25**, is the first time this new day is being observed.

In his message for this day, Pope Francis recalls that, according to tradition, God sent an angel, in a dream, to console Saint Joachim when he felt helpless because he and Saint Anne had no children. The angel said they should not despair, the Lord heard their prayers and they would have a beloved child – Marv!

The Holy Father continues: "The Lord continues to send angels to console our loneliness and to remind us: 'I am with you always.' He says this to you, and He says it to me. That is the meaning of this day. May every grandfather, every grandmother, every older person, especially those among us who are most alone, receive the visit of an angel!"

To participate in this new celebration, the Pope encourages grandchildren to visit or otherwise communicate with their grandparents, pray for them and entrust to God those who have died. Pope Francis also has permitted a plenary indulgence, under the usual circumstances, to grandparents, the elderly and others who participate in a solemn celebration of this day and to those who spend time (actually or virtually) with an elderly person in need. Celebrating Saint James

July 25 also is the **Feast of Saint James**. When his feast falls on a Sunday, as it does this year, it is celebrated as a Jubilee or Holy Year in Santiago de Compostela, Spain, the culmination of the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage route and traditional burial site of Saint James. The Holy Year in Santiago dates back to the 15th century with just 14 Holy Years marking the feast every century; the next will be 2027 and 2032.

Pope Francis has extended the current Holy Year to include all of 2022 due to the global pandemic and the interruption of pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela. During this time, the Holy Door of the Cathedral of Santiago is open and visitors there may obtain plenary indulgences.

If you are considering making the Camino pilgrimage during the Holy Year, you might want to participate with the Basilica of Saint Mary in 2022. Be sure to stay tuned for more details!

Saints on the Calendar This Week

July 26. Saints Joachim and Anne, Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Names for the parents of Mary are found in the 2nd century *Protoevangelium of James*. Veneration of Anne originated in the 6th century. In the East, she is patroness of childless women and miners. Devotion to Joachim dates from the 8th century.

July 29. Saint Martha. 1st century. Sister of Mary and Lazarus; model of hospitality and faithful disciple; confessed her faith in Jesus as the Son of God. Patroness of housewives, waiters and waitresses.

July 30. Saint Peter Chrysologus, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. Called "Chrysologus," meaning "of golden speech," for his exceptional preaching ability; 170 homilies are extant; bishop of Ravenna. Died c. 450.

July 31. Saint Ignatius of Loyola, Priest. Solider, founded the Compania de Jesus (Society of Jesus or Jesuits), approved by Pope Paul III in 1540. Author of the *Spiritual Exercises*; founded the Roman College. At his death, the Society numbered 1,000 in 76 houses in 12 provinces. Today numbers some 16,740 members. Patron of retreatants and soldiers. Died in 1556.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: What is a "sacramental"?

A: A "sacramental" is an object – rosary, medal, scapular, crucifix, statue, icon, etc. – blessed by a priest, bishop or deacon. When used in conjunction with prayer, the sacramental invokes God's blessing and reminds us of his love and generosity. Sacramentals must always be used in a holy manner; they are not "good luck" charms or magical objects. Rather, they serve as tangible reminders of the supernatural, invisible gifts God gives to us.

To bless a sacramental object, the priest, bishop or deacon normally makes the sign of the cross with his right hand over the object while reciting a prayer of blessing. He also may sprinkle holy water on it. (By the way, holy water is a sacramental, too, since it is water that has been blessed.)





AROUND OUR PARISH & BEYOND

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish

since its founding in 1795



SAINT MARY'S BOXING CLUB


Sports historically played a prominent role in the social life of Saint Mary's young male parishioners. When Father Denis J. O'Kane (pastor 1872-1891) had the Lyceum built in 1888, he realized sports would be a magnet, drawing the young people of Alexandria to Saint Mary.

The Boys' Boxing Club Team especially acquired a national reputation for producing AAU and Golden Glove champions. By the 1930s, boxing matches in our Lyceum auditorium became a very popular form of entertainment. In 1938, Father Joseph L. Leitch, assistant pastor, organized a championship Saint Mary's team. A former high school athlete, he wanted to keep the boys and young men of Alexandria off the streets and out of trouble.

After World War II began, many of the young boxers enlisted in the military. One of the first to fight for his country was Al Horton, featherweight champion in 1939 and 1940. Horton, the "Kid with the Perfect Jab," won 166 consecutive victories as a Marine and was the Marine Corps champion of the South Pacific. Severe shrapnel wounds suffered in battle ended his boxing career.

Reno Workman, a lanky 6-foot-4 country boy, walked or rode his bike 11 miles every night to learn boxing from Saint Mary's coach Naaman Massey. In the 1942 National Golden Gloves semifinals in Madison Square Garden, Workman suffered a severe gash over his right eye. Tournament officials expected him to forfeit the match. But Massey, an expert "cut man," patched the eye so well the wound did not reopen. Workman scored an unbelievable upset and won the national 175-pound championship for Saint Mary parish!

Saint Mary's team continued its success in subsequent years, with four of five Saint Mary boxers winning their events in the 1944 D.C. Championship. In 1945, the club won the Capital City tournament. In its 14-year existence, the Saint Mary Boys Club Boxing Team never lost a team match, a feat recorded in the *Encyclopedia Britannica*! The team was phased out in 1951 as its members grew older, married and assumed family responsibilities. Unfortunately, younger boys did not seem interested in the sport.

When you visit the Lyceum auditorium, look closely at the floor. You'll see four brass circles embedded in the floor, marking the location of the four corner posts of the old boxing ring. The legacy of champions remains!




