DEDICATION OF SAINT MARY MAJOR & THE MIRACLE OF THE SNOW – August 5

In celebration of a 4th-century Marian miracle, known as the "Miracle of the Snow," it has been customary for white rose petals to be dropped from the ceiling of the Basilica di Santa Maria Maggiore, or Saint Mary Major, in Rome on **August 5**. That feast day marks the basilica's dedication.

According to legend, during the night of August 4/5 in 358 AD (some sources say it was 352 AD), the wealthy Roman patrician Giovanni had a vision of the Virgin Mary. She instructed him to build a basilica dedicated to her where he would find miraculous snow the following day. In the morning, Giovanni spoke to Pope Liberius, who said he had the same vision. They discovered the snow – during the heat of the Roman summer – on the Esquiline Hill. The pope is said to have traced the perimeter of the church on the snow-whitened ground. The basilica was eventually built, financed by the wealthy Giovanni and his wife.

Here at the Basilica of Saint Mary in Alexandria, we will again honor the feast day with silk petals falling from the church ceiling at the conclusion of our 12:10 p.m. Mass on Friday, August 5. I hope you can attend – it's a marvelously ethereal event! The Mass also will be livestreamed.

FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD – August 6

Telling His disciples that He would be put to death in Jerusalem, Christ went up Mount Tabor with Peter, James and John. "He was transfigured before them. And His face did shine as the sun and His garments became white as snow" (Matthew 17:2).

The Transfiguration foretells the glory of the Lord as God, and His Ascension into heaven. It anticipates the glory of heaven, where we shall see God face to face. Through grace, we already share in His divine promise of eternal life.

Liturgical Calendar This Week

<u>August 1</u>. Saint Alphonsus Ligouri, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. Lawyer; founded (1732) the Redemptorists. Stressed Christ's love and Mary's intercession. Bishop of Saint' Agata dei Goti; master of moral theology. Patron of confessors and moral theologians.

<u>August 2</u>. Saint Eusebius of Vercelli, Bishop. Founder of the canons regular in the West, uniting clerical and monastic life; tortured and exiled to Palestine by Constantine. Died in 371. Saint Peter Julian Eymard, Priest. Founded (1856) Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament, devoted to the Eucharist as center of the life of the Church and society. Died in 1868.

<u>August 4</u>. Saint John Vianney, Priest. "Cure of Ars," patron of parish priests. As a seminarian, he struggled with school, especially Latin. At his 1815 ordination, the vicar general said, "The Church wants not only learned priests but, even more, holy ones." Died August 4, 1859; canonized May 31, 1925.

<u>August 5</u>. Dedication of the Basilica of Saint Mary Major. Oldest basilica in the West dedicated to the Mother of God; dedicated in Rome by Pope Sixtus after declaration of Mary as *Theotokos* ("God-bearer") by the Council of Ephesus in 431.

<u>August 6</u>. The Transfiguration of the Lord. Transfigured in glory, the Son of Man received kingship and dominion and will come again in glory. Celebrated since the 5th century, officially included in the general Church calendar in 1457.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

In preparation for its 50th anniversary, our Arlington Diocese is marking this year with the theme: "Remember," reflecting on the Eucharist and Christ's words during the Last Supper: "Do this in remembrance of me." An article in the *Arlington Catholic Herald* (June 30-July 13, 2022), "The Eucharist Explained," explores various aspects of Holy Communion, incorporating information from Matthew Tsakanikas, a theology professor at Christendom College. Following is an excerpt from that article:

O: What is transubstantiation?

A: In the 1500s, the Council of Trent declared, "Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly His body that He was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the Body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of His Blood. This change the Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation." Centuries before, in 1215, the Fourth Lateran Council had affirmed this teaching.







FROM THE ARCHIVES

A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish since its founding in 1795



DEFENDING THE FAITH



Subtle hints of antipathy between Alexandria's Catholics and non-Catholics in the 19th century can be found in old parish records. For example, several baptisms recorded by Father John Aiken (pastor, 1845-1850) are of infants or children in danger of death, secretly baptized because their parents were Protestant.

The following entry, made October 25, 1851, by Father Joseph Bixio, S.J., shows that an elderly woman was abandoned by her family when she converted: *Ann Pomeroy, baptized on the 23rd on her death bed, near 70 years old. Buried to-day. The connections are all Protestants. The Catholics gave everything for, and I paid all the expenses of the funeral.*

Defensive pride in their faith can be seen in the wills or deathbed testimonials of many 19th-century parishioners. The following poignant entry by Father Aiken is a good example: *April 26, 1847. Margaret Burns, eldest daughter of Thomas Burns. Age about 13 years old, died in the most edifying manner and was buried in St. Mary's Burial Ground. She said to one of her companions, "I would not give up my religion if a thousand guns were pointed at me."*

Prominent Alexandria attorney George W. Brent felt the necessity to formally state in his will (dated January 1872): I die in faith of the Holy Roman Catholic Church. My children have been baptized in that faith. I desire to be buried in the Catholic church yard..... — Kitty Guy, Parish Historian


