INDEPENDENCE DAY AND THE RIGHT TO LIVE OUT OUR FAITH

As we celebrate our nation's independence this weekend with fireworks and cookouts, let's also reflect on the religious freedom promised in the Declaration of Independence. Our forebearers sought to establish a new nation where they – and generations of Americans to come – could worship freely. Sadly, that freedom is under attack today.



In a statement for Religious Freedom Week 2021 (June 22-29), Arlington Bishop Michael F. Burbidge noted our country was founded "on the freedom to live out our faith publicly."

Bishop Burbidge continued: "We must remain steadfast in our commitment to live virtuously and carry out acts of service, despite the sad reality that real threats to religious freedom exist. At the forefront are troubling attempts to remove the truth of human sexuality from the public square by redefining gender, as proposed in the Equality Act, and silencing voices that disagree. This act threatens to remove conscience protections for physicians, counselors and others, while simultaneously harming vulnerable populations. It leads to confusion, especially among young people, and introduces a significant risk to women and girls who seek protection in shelters and other safe places."

I encourage you to sign up for Action Alerts from the Virginia Catholic Conference (VCC), the public policy arm of the Bishops of the Dioceses of Arlington and Richmond, at https://vacatholic.org/action-center/. The VCC advocates for public policy that reflects natural law, advances human dignity and serves the common good. As Catholics we have the duty "to work with civil authority for building up society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity and freedom" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* 2255). The *Catechism* also says the "loyal collaboration" between citizen and country "includes the right, and at times the duty, to voice their just criticism of that which seems harmful to the dignity of persons and to the good of the community" (*CCC* 2238).

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: Do we become angels when we go to heaven?

A: No, we don't. The Catholic Church teaches that angels were created by God and are separate from humans. They have been present since creation and are purely spiritual beings with intellect and will. The word "angel" comes from the Greek *aggelos*, a translation of the Hebrew *malakh*, meaning messenger. The word describes their job rather than their being. They praise God, reveal God's will to earthly beings and generally go about doing God's bidding.

Angels are found throughout Sacred Scripture. In the Old Testament, an angel stopped Abraham from sacrificing his son Isaac and an angel of mercy saved Daniel in the lion's den. In the New Testament, the Archangel Gabriel was sent to seek Mary's cooperation in the Incarnation of Jesus Christ and hosts of heavenly angles heralded His birth. In Matthew, Jesus describes 12 legions of angels awaiting His command. And, angels are important in the Book of Revelation as they announced the Second Coming of Christ and the Last Judgement.


AROUND OUR PARISH & BEYOND

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish

A periodic look at the history since its founding in 1795.



FATHER O'HAGAN, CIVIL WAR CHAPLAIN



Father Joseph P. O'Hagan, S.J., served as an assistant priest at Saint Mary in 1862. He also served as chaplain with the Union Army of the Potomac during the Civil War. More than 1,500 soldiers, mostly from Irish Catholic New York regiments, attended Sunday Masses on the battlefields.

Father O'Hagan wrote a series of detailed letters describing his horrendous experiences. One of the most vivid was his description of the Battle of Fredericksburg (Marye's Hill) in December 1862:

The Confederate troops, on the top of the hill, cut down the Union forces column after column...as fast as they could advance...and could never imagine as many dead could be left on one field. They were actually in heaps... I do not know, not do I care much, provided our poor men are not led to another butchery. It is horrible, and I am only surprised that the entire nation does not rise up against it unanimously.

Nearly 13,000 troops were killed or wounded in that engagement. After the war, Father O'Hagan returned to Georgetown to teach and later became president of Holy Cross College. He became ill and died while at sea, in the Gulf of Mexico, while on a trip with Georgetown President Father Patrick F. Healy in 1878.

The Seven Sisters Apostolate is a call to strengthen the Church by ensuring that a Holy Hour is prayed each day of the week for the sole intention of a specific priest or bishop — a "holy wasting" (cf. Matthew 26:10) or lavishing of prayer for his deeper conformity to Christ. A Seven Sisters group begins when at least seven women respond to a call to the mis-

sion of the apostolate. Each woman agrees to pray for one hour on a specific day of the week for a particular priest. The coordinator of a group is known as the Anchoress.

We have a Seven Sisters Apostolate here at the Basilica of Saint Mary. Seven women have been praying for our Pastor, Father Hathaway, for the last year and a half. One woman is retiring from the group, so we need one more Sister for Father Hathaway (Friday is the open slot). There is also a desire to form groups to pray for both Father David and our newly ordained Parochial Vicar, Father Joseph Townsend.

Liturgical Calendar This Week

July 5. Saint Anthony Zaccaria, Priest. Doctor turned priest. Founded (1530) in Milan the Clerics Regular of Saint Paul (Barnabites) for the reform of society; today with about 400 members. Sought collaboration between the clergy and the laity; promoted frequent communion. Died in 1539 age 36. Saint Elizabeth of Portugal. Named after her great-aunt, Elizabeth of Hungary. Queen and mother; lover of the poor and peacemaker in the royal family; later a Franciscan tertiary. Patroness of Catholic charities. Died in 1336.

July 6. Saint Maria Goretti, Virgin and Martyr. Died in 1906 at age 11. Stabbed to death by a neighbor named Alessandro, choosing to die rather than be raped. During his imprisonment, Maria appeared to Alessandro and forgave him. With her mother present, Maria was canonized in 1950. She is the patroness of teenage girls.

July 9. Saint Augustine Zhao Rong, Priest, and Companions, Martyrs. 120 martyrs honored this day died between 1648 and 1930. Most were born in China and ranged in age from 9 to 72; included four Chinese priests. Thirty-three foreign-born martyrs were mostly priests or women religious. Augustine Zhao Rong was a Chinese soldier who accompanied a bishop to his martyrdom. Moved by the bishop's courage, Augustine sought baptism and was later ordained a priest. He was martyred in 1815.

AROUND OUR PARISH & BEYOND

FORMER SAINT MARY PARISHIONER ORDAINED A CARTHUSIAN PRIEST

Former Saint Mary parishioner and Arlington diocesan seminarian Rob Kennedy was ordained a Carthusian priest on May 22 at the Carthusians' Charterhouse of the Transfiguration in Arlington, VT. Ordained by Bishop Salvatore Matano of Rochester, NY, he has taken the name Dom Maximus Marie Kennedy.

Dom Maximus attended Saint Mary school as a child and his mother, Jane, was a teacher there. He lived in the Arlington diocese until he left for college in 2002 and was a diocesan seminarian from 2003 to 2008, when he entered the Charterhouse of the Transfiguration. He made his solemn profession of vows as a Carthusian on August 6, 2017. Dom Maximus celebrated his first Mass according to the Carthusian rite on Pentecost 2021.

The Carthusian order was founded in France by Saint Bruno in 1084 and has charterhouses worldwide. Carthusian monks first came to the United States in the 1950s. The life of a Carthusian is centered on contemplation and its members live largely in solitude within a community.


