

Liturgical Calendar This Week

— June 21. Saint Aloysius Gonzaga, Religious. Jesuit scholastic. Died in 1591 at age 23, caring for the sick. Strongly devoted to the Eucharist, interior prayer and charitable service. Patron of youth and of students in Jesuit colleges and universities.

— June 22. Saint Paulinus of Nola, Bishop. From a wealthy Roman family; gave up a life in politics to become a monk, bishop and revered Catholic poet of the 5th century. Also noted for his attention to the poor. Saints John Fisher, Bishop, and Thomas More, Martyrs. John Fisher was beheaded on June 22, 1535; chancellor of Cambridge University; bishop of Rochester; dedicated pastor of souls. Defender of the Church against Luther and of the Roman primacy against Henry VIII. Thomas More was beheaded on July 6, 1535. Humanist and chancellor of England. Refused to support Henry VIII's divorce of Queen Catherine and his Act of Supremacy; patron of lawyers, statesmen, politicians and our Diocese of Arlington.

— June 24. The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist.
This feast dates back to the 4th century. Celebrated, per Lk 1:36, six months before the birth of Jesus.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: Why do we say "And with your spirit" to the priest at Mass? Where do we get those words?

A: In his words of greeting at the beginning of Mass, the priest says: "The Lord be with you." We respond: "And with your spirit." Our words acknowledge the Holy Spirit's activity through the priest during the Sacred Liturgy. Our response also refers to the "spirit" of the priest, the very core of his being, and the special graces given to him at ordination. Indeed, we are acknowledging that since God works through the priest who is offering the Mass, ultimately it is Jesus Christ who leads the community gathered for the liturgy. It is the Holy Spirit who is the primary actor in the liturgy, regardless who the particular priest celebrating Mass may be.

"And with your spirit" is found in the letters of Saint Paul in the New Testament and is often how he ends his letters (see Galatians 6:18).

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish

since its founding in 1795.



PRIESTS AT SAINT MARY — 1830s THROUGH 1850s (Part 2)

Pastors at Saint Mary during the 1840s and 1850s were assisted by a number of interesting and colorful priests. Most, but not all, were Jesuits from Georgetown University. Among them were:



Father James Ryder, S.J. (at Saint Mary parish in 1857-59), sailed from Alexandria in 1820 to study in Rome. He became a close friend of Archbishop Giovanni Ferretti, who was later elected Pope Pius IX. Father Ryder returned to the United States for ordination in 1829. A renowned preacher, he spent considerable time travelling and conducting retreats and missions. He had many friends in the U.S. Congress and participated in President William Henry Harrison's funeral in 1841. He also was a close friend of Harrison's successor, President John Tyler, whose son attended Georgetown University.

Father Samuel Barber, S.J. (at Saint Mary parish in 1858), was the son of Jerushe Booth and Virgil Horace Barber, New Englanders and converts who both entered religious life in 1822. Jerushe entered the Visitandine Order of nuns and Virgil became a Jesuit. They brought their children to live with them in their convent or Jesuit novitiate! Young Samuel was eight at the time. He graduated from Georgetown in 1830 and followed in his father's footsteps by becoming a Jesuit. — Kitty Guy, Parish Historian

Prayer Warriors Needed!



The Seven Sisters Apostolate is a call to strengthen the Church by ensuring that a Holy Hour is prayed each day of the week for the sole intention of a specific priest or bishop — a "holy wasting" (cf. Matthew 26:10) or lavishing of prayer for his deeper conformity to Christ.

A Seven Sisters group begins when at least seven women respond to a call to the mis-

sion of the apostolate. Each woman agrees to pray for one hour on a specific day of the week for a particular priest. The coordinator of a group is known as the Anchoress.

We now have a Seven Sisters Apostolate here at the Basilica of Saint Mary. Seven women have been praying for our Pastor, Father Hathaway, for the last year and a half. One woman is retiring from the group, so we need one more Sister for Father Hathaway (Friday is the open slot). There is also a desire to form groups to pray for both Father David (already has one Sister) and our newly ordained Parochial Vicar, Father Joseph Townsend.


