# Liturgical Calendar This Week

May 18. Saint John I, Pope and Martyr. From Siena, Italy. Sent to Constantinople by the Ostrogoth king to negotiate better treatment for the Arians. While he was relatively successful, on his return to Ravenna, the king had the Pope imprisoned for allegedly conspiring with Constantinople. Ill and worn out from his travels, he died in Ravenna.

May 20. Saint Bernardine of Siena, Priest. Franciscan reformer, eloquent preacher; traveled and preached throughout Italy; encouraged devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus. He died in 1444.

May 21. Saint Christopher Magallanes and Companions, Martyrs. Magallanes, 21 priests and three laymen were shot or hanged (1915-37) for their association with the Cristero uprising that opposed the anti-Catholic Mexican government in the 1920s. The Cristero motto was "Long live Christ the King and the Virgin of Guadalupe!"

# Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

# Q: Are Catholic individuals who get married outside of the Church, really married?

A: No, not in the eyes of God nor His Church.

For the baptized, marriage is a Sacrament. Like the other six Sacraments, it is governed by "form and matter." Simply put, for example, for the Mass the form are the words of consecration said by a priest, and the matter is the priest himself, as well as pure bread and wine.

Therefore, for Catholics who attempt marriage not according to the form and matter of the Sacrament (exchanging their vows in the presence of a priest or deacon and two witnesses) do not receive the Sacrament of Matrimony. Therefore, from that point forward of simulation of a Sacrament, they have placed themselves outside of communion with the Catholic Church. This is rectified by actually receiving the Sacrament of Matrimony in a valid ceremony, often called "convalidation."


# Saints, Stewards, Scholars NEWS from The Basilica School of Saint Mary



# FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish since its founding in 1795



# THE MYSTERY BELL



If you have driven past The Basilica School of Saint Mary on Green Street recently, you have seen the large scaffolding surrounding the cupola. Although the cupola is a distinctive architectural feature, it has another function — a bell tower. The bell itself has a long history. According to a 1989 newspaper article, it was cast in 1811 and purchased by Father Francis Ignatius Neale (pastor 1795-1818) in 1817 when he added a bell tower to the chapel that became Saint Mary Church. That chapel was purchased from the Methodists in 1810. A much older tradition is that the bell originally was purchased by the Methodist pastor for their chapel because a law required houses of worship to be identified by a bell, making it older than 1811.

Whatever its origin, the bell called Saint Mary parishioners to Mass and daily prayers for at least 40 years. In 1857, Father John Blox, then pastor, renovated and expanded the

church. He added a 133-foot steeple, said to have been the highest in Alexandria. A large new bell was hung there.

The old bell was not discarded. Saint Mary's Hall, a large brick building used for meetings, Sunday School, special programs and cultural activities, was built on the corner of Royal and Wolfe Streets by the Young Catholic Friends Society in 1858. A small white cupola was placed on its roof. The old bell had a new home. After the Civil War, in 1869, the hall became Saint Mary's parochial school.

According to Mary P. Davis, who attended the old school in the 1940s and became principal of the new Saint Mary School in 1987, the bell rang every school day to call the children to class and for the noon Angelus. When a new school was built on Green Street, the bell was placed in its cupola and continued to be used for a number of years. There was a small, round hole in the upstairs library where the rope was hanging, so it could be rung from inside the school. At some point, a principal stopped the daily practice, likely when an electronic buzzer made the bell obsolete. The old bell remained hidden above the ceiling, forgotten until 1989, when Custodian Harold Crook located it. He recalled the small hole in the library. which had gone unnoticed for many years.



In March 1989, the bell was again rung for the Angelus during Catholic Schools Week. Now, the old bell will return to its home when the current cupola restoration is completed. We hope to hear it ring again!


