

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Today, **Sunday, May 16**, the Church celebrates the Ascension of the Lord. This is one of the great solemnities of the liturgical calendar, commemorating Christ's triumphant "going up" bodily into heaven, by His own power, in the presence of the Apostles, the Blessed Mother and His disciples, 40 days after His Resurrection at Easter (Acts 1:6-12). Where Christ went, body and soul, into heaven, the faithful hope one day to follow. May we always rejoice and be comforted in that hope.

POPE FRANCIS MAKES ADDITIONS TO THE LITANY OF SAINT JOSEPH



During this Year of Saint Joseph, many of us have been reciting the beautiful Litany of Saint Joseph (https://yearofstjoseph.org/devotions/prayers/). On **May 1**, the Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker, Pope Francis added seven new invocations to that litany. Taken from the writings of recent popes, the new invocations were issued in Latin. It will be up to the bishops' conferences of various countries to officially translate the words into the local language.

The new Saint Joseph Litany invocations, with unofficial English translations from the Vatican, are:

- Custos Redemptoris (Guardian of the Redeemer), the title of Pope Saint John Paul II's 1989 apostolic exhortation on Saint Joseph
- Serve Christi (Servant of Christ), taken from the homily of Pope Saint Paul VI for Saint Joseph's feast day in 1966
- Minister Salutis (Minister of Salvation), a title used by Saint John Chrysostom, quoted by John Paul II in 1989
- *Fulcimen in Difficultatibus* (Guide/Supporter in Difficulties), from the 2020 apostolic letter *Patris Corde*, issued by Pope Francis for the 150th anniversary of the 1870 declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church
- Patrone Exsulum (Patron/Protector of Exiles), from Patris Corde
- Patrone Afflictorum (Patron/Protector of the Afflicted), from Patris Corde
- **Patrone Pauperum** (Patron/Protector of the Poor), also from Patris Corde

The POWER AND ROLE OF INTERCESSORY PRAYER

As Catholics, we often turn to litanies and other forms of "intercessory prayer" to seek the help of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Joseph and other saints in times of need. For example, Pope Francis has asked us to pray the rosary each day in this month of May, seeking Our Lady's intercession for an end to the coronavirus pandemic.

Of course, we know Christ is our best mediator with God. Intercessory prayer – asking the saints for help – is not the same thing as mediation. Intercession is subordinate and optional. We, as mere humans, certainly need Christ as our divine mediator with the Father. The intercession of the saints is not a necessity – but it can help! It's like asking a family member or good friend to pray for us.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: Why does the pope change his name? Who chooses the new name? A: It's tradition. Once a man is elected pope, he can choose whatever name he wants. Almost all popes have chosen a name honoring a saint or a previous pope whom they admired or whose work they hoped to continue or emulate. The tradition also reflects the fact that important figures in the Bible were given new names when chosen for new and weighty jobs: Abram became Abraham, Jacob became Israel, Simon became Peter and Saul became Paul.

For popes, it apparently began with John II, elected in 533. He was born with the name Mercurious, after the god Mercury. He changed his name to John, likely concerned that a pope named after a pagan god was not appropriate.

It was not until Sergius IV (1009) that subsequent popes continued the tradition of popes changing their name. (The last to retain his baptismal name was Pope Marcellus II in 1555. His birth name was Marcello Cervini degli Spannochii, so Marcellus was a variation of his birth name.)

Thus, following tradition, recent popes have chosen new names: Karol Josef Wojtyla became Pope John Paul II when he was elected in 1978, Joseph Ratzinger became Pope Benedict XVI in 2005 and Jorge Mario Bergoglio became Pope Francis in 2013.

A periodic look at the history



SAINT MARY'S ONLY MISSION CHURCH IN MARYLAND

The first successful mission of Saint Mary was our only mission in Maryland, Saint Ignatius Loyola, established in 1849 on the Alexandria Ferry Road (now Brinkley Road) in Oxon Hill.

Father Joseph Finotti of Saint Mary also served as founding pastor of Saint Ignatius. Saint Mary parishioners who led the effort to build the mission church included the Daingerfield family. Maria Rozier, owner of Notley Hall (where Father Thayer stayed after visiting Alexandria's Catholics in 1795), was the wife of Dr. William Daingerfield. In addition to their estate in Oxon Hill, the Daingerfields lived in a townhouse at 917 King Street in Alexandria. Dr. Daingerfield also owned the Alexandria Ferry.



The Oxon Hill parishioners first attended Mass at the home of the Surratt family (Mary Jenkins Surratt later was among the conspirators convicted and hung in 1865 for the assassination President Abraham Lincoln). The original church was partially funded by money collected by Mary Surratt and other women of the parish. Land for the new mission church was donated by two Episcopalians, a Doctor Folson and a Major Edelen.

The first church was completed in 1850 and dedicated by the Most Reverend Samuel Eccleston, Archbishop of Baltimore. The Reverend James Ryder, Rector of Georgetown College and an outstanding preacher of the time, delivered the sermon. The original, simple wooden structure was replaced in 1890 by a larger frame church with a tall steeple, still in use today.

Diocesan boundary lines were redrawn and Saint Ignatius parish eventually was placed under the jurisdiction of Saint Mary of the Assumption Church in Upper Marlboro, MD, and became part of the Archdiocese of Baltimore. The church remained a mission until 1948 when Cardinal Patrick O'Boyle of the Archdiocese of Washington declared it a parish with a resident pastor. The 1890 church was declared a national historic - Kitty Guy, Parish Historian landmark in 1974.


MAKE A REGIONAL MARIAN PILGRIMAGE THIS MONTH

For centuries, Catholics have recognized May as the "Month of Mary." One of the special ways we can venerate Mary during this month is to make a Marian pilgrimage. The May Marian pilgrimage was a favorite devotion of Saint Josemaría Escrivá, founder of Opus Dei. In 1935, after his first visit to the Sonsoles Shrine near Avila, Spain, he established the custom of a May pilgrimage for people in Opus Dei. Each May, members continue to make a pilgrimage to a shrine or other place where Mary is venerated.

In the spirit of this tradition, the Basilica of Saint Mary is encouraging parishioners to make a May Marian pilgrimage. There are several Marian sites in the region and you could visit them all in one day. We are calling this route the Camino de María.

Liturgical Calendar This Week

— May 16. Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Commemorates the ascent of Jesus Christ into heaven on the 40th day after His Resurrection at Easter.

May 18. Saint John I, Pope and Martyr. From Siena, Italy. Sent on a diplomatic mission to Constantinople by the Ostrogoth king to negotiate better treatment for Arians. Although relatively successful, on his return to Ravenna, the king had the Pope imprisoned for allegedly conspiring with Constantinople. He died there, ill and worn our from his travels.
 May 20. Saint Bernardine of Siena, Priest. Order of Friars Minor (Franciscan). Reformer, eloquent preacher; traveled throughout Italy. Encouraged devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus; known for his use of the monogram IHS, an abbreviation of the Greek name for Jesus. Patron of advertisers and advertising. His aid is invoked for hoarseness. Died in 1444.
 May 21. Saint Christopher Magallanes and Companions, Martyrs. Magallanes and 21 diocesan priests and three laymen were either shot or hanged (1915-37) for their association with the Cristero uprising that opposed the anti-Catholic Mexican government. The Cristero motto was "Long live Christ the King and the Virgin of Guadalupe!"

— May 22. Saint Rita of Cascia, Religious. Born in 1381 in Umbria. Lived with a brutal husband and had twos sons. After the violent murder of her husband, she urged forgiveness in contrast to the customary vendetta of her day. Became an Augustinian nun and spent 40 years in prayer, contemplation and service to the sick and poor. Toward the end of her life, she received a wound from a thorn from the Crown of Thorns. She died in 1457. Patron saint of desperate situations.
