NEW PRIEST ASSIGNMENTS

This time of year inevitably brings the reassignment of some priests in our Arlington Diocese. While bittersweet, these changes are part of the life of a parish priest as he assists the Bishop in the smooth functioning of the diocese. New assignments also help prepare parochial vicars (priests who assist the pastor) as future pastors by giving them experience with different models of parish life and organization.

Two changes, effective June 24, impact our Basilica family.

After two years of faithful service as parochial vicar here at Saint Mary (since his ordination to the priesthood in 2019), Father Nicholas Blank has been reassigned as parochial vicar at Saint John the Evangelist Parish in Warrenton. We will miss him, of course, but know God has great plans for him in Warrenton! All are invited to expressed your gratitude for Father's priestly service at a farewell reception for him following the 1 p.m. Mass on **Sunday, June 20**.





Deacon Joseph Townsend, who will be ordained to the priesthood on **June 5**, will be our new parochial vicar. Last year, he was at the Basilica of Saint Mary for his summer assignment. He is a graduate of Christendom College (like Father Nicholas) and is currently studying at the Pontifical North American College in Rome. Also like Father Nicholas, Deacon Townsend was homeschooled and is the oldest in a family of nine children! Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: What is Canon Law?

A: Canon Law (from Ancient Greek: κανών, *kanon*, a "straight measuring rod, ruler") is a set of ordinances and regulations made by the Church leadership for the internal governance of the Church and its members. It was the first modern Western legal system and is the oldest continuously functioning legal system in the West. The book containing these laws is known as the Code of Canon Law. The Code currently includes 1,752 canons.

Canon Law affects the everyday Catholic by regulating how our faith should be lived. For example, Canon Law includes criteria for baptism and funerals, how and when marriages take place, rules for fasting and the process by which Church leaders are chosen.

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish

A periodic look at the history since its founding in 1795.



ANTI-CATHOLIC SENTIMENT

In the late 19th century, a wave of anti-Catholicism swept through the United States as immigrants from Ireland, Italy, and Central and Eastern Europe flooded into the country. Nearly all of these new arrivals were Roman Catholic.

Condescension toward Catholics led churches to develop their own parish culture centers – libraries, reading rooms, even athletic facilities. Organizations that sought to instill pride in Catholics and promote Catholic heritage also became popular. Active examples at Saint Mary parish were the Ancient Order of Hibernians, Knights of Columbus and Daughters of Isabella, later renamed the Catholic Daughters of the Americas. They marched proudly in parades and participated in many of Alexandria's civic and cultural events.

However, the specter of anti-Catholic bigotry was never far away. One small but frightening act of vandalism was reported by the *Alexandria Gazette* (April 11, 1898):



Some individual, animated by fiendishness or intemperate zeal for ecclesiastical preferences, entered St. Mary's Church recently and emptied carbolic acid into the receptacles for holy water. On entering the church subsequent-

ly, a lady detected the odor of the acid for which she was unable to account. The pastor of the church was notified and on investigation it was found that a quantity of the deadly drug had been poured into the holy water and also into the baptismal font.... The incident has caused considerable comment in the community, and both Catholics and Protestants are indignant and disgusted at such an act of vandalism in old Alexandria, where no matter at what shrines we worship, all are supposed to have been taught to respect each other's ecclesiastical preferences and to live as one in a peaceful body politic. – Kitty Guy, Parish Historian

Liturgical Calendar This Week

- May 23. Pentecost Sunday. This solemnity commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles.
- May 24. Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. On February 11, 2018, the Vatican designated the Monday after Pentecost to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary as Mother of the Church. Mary is at once Mother of Christ, the Son of God and mother of the members of His Mystical Body, which is the Church.
- —May 25. Saint Bede the Venerable, Priest and Doctor of the Church. Benedictine born in 735 in Northumbria. Known as the "Father of English History." Saint Gregory VII, Pope. Benedictine from Tuscany. Championed reform of the clergy against simony, clerical marriage and lay investiture, leading to the excommunication of Henry IV. Died in 1085. Saint Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi, Virgin. Carmelite mystic of Florence; led a hidden life of prayer and self-denial, praying for the renewal of the Church and encouraging her fellow sisters in holiness. Instrumental in reforming her Order. Died in 1607.
- May 26. Saint Philip Neri, Priest. Founded (1575) the Congregation of Priests of the Oratory, now numbering about 550 members, to promote holiness of priestly life and foster effective preaching.
- May 27. Saint Augustine of Canterbury, Bishop. Sent with 40 other monks by Pope Gregory I to England. Ordained a bishop in 597; established the Sees of Canterbury, London and Rochester. Became Primate of England in 601; died in 604. May 29. Saint Paul VI, Pope. Born Giovanni Battista Montini in 1897; ordained a priest in 1920; worked 30 years at the Vatican Secretariat of State. 1954 became archbishop of Milan; named a cardinal in 1958 by Pope John XXIII; helped prepare Vatican II. Elected pope in June 1963. Died August 6, 1978; beatified October 19, 2014; canonized October 14, 2018.


