THE MOST HOLY TRINITY - May 30

In the name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Today, **May 30**, is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, celebrating a mystery most central to our Christian faith: Our firm belief of three persons in one God (not three gods).

"The divine persons do not share the one divinity among themselves but each of them is God whole and entire: 'The Father is that which the Son is, the Son is that which the Father is, the Father and Son that which the Holy Spirit is, i.e., by nature one God." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* 253 and Council of Toledo XI, 675)

THE VISITATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY & MEMORIAL DAY – May 31

Monday, May 31 is the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, recalling Elizabeth's encounter with her cousin Mary, the bearer of the Son of God. May we, too, echo Mary's joy as she responded: "The Almighty has done great things for me and holy is His Name."

May 31 also is Memorial Day, a time to pause, remember and pay tribute to those who died while serving in the U.S. Armed Forces.

Our Parish Offices will be closed. We will have two Masses that day: One at 9 a.m. in the



Basilica and a second Mass (with our traditional May crowning) at 10 a.m. in Saint Mary's cemetery at 1001 South Royal Street, near the school. (You will find ample parking in the adjacent school playground.) In case of rain, there will be no 10 a.m. Mass and the May crowning will take place in the Basilica following the 9 a.m. Mass.


Our Parish Offices will be closed in honor of Memorial Day, Monday, May 31

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: Who were the "scribes" mentioned in the Bible?

A: Scribes were a class of well-educated Jews who studied and explained the law. Occasionally they were referred to as lawyers or rabbis (Matthew 23:7). They were not priests. Some scribes were members of the highest Jewish court, the Sanhedrin (Matthew 26:57).

Because they were devoted to defending and preserving the law, they considered Jesus a threat to their security and standing in the Jewish community. They challenged and baited him (Mark 2:16) on numerous occasions and, ultimately, they participated in plotting Christ's death (Luke 22:1-2).

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish

A periodic look at the history since its founding in 1795.



PRIESTS AT SAINT MARY - 1830s THROUGH 1850s (Part 1)

Pastors at Saint Mary during the 1840s and 1850s were assisted by a number of interesting and colorful priests. Most, but not all, were Jesuits. Among them were:

Father James Curley, S.J. (served at Saint Mary in 1837), an Irish priest who came to the United States in 1817. He taught natural philosophy and mathematics at Georgetown, subjects he taught himself as a child. An astronomer, he built Georgetown's observatory. He was a friend of President Abraham Lincoln, who once gave him a chair!



Battle of Monterrey, 1846

Father Anthony Rey, S.J. (served at Saint Mary in 1841), a native of Switzerland. During the Mexican War, President James K. Polk recruited chaplains to serve the U.S. troops, one-third of whom were Catholics. Father Rey was one of two faculty members from Georgetown who volunteered. He won praise for ministering to the troops at the Battle of Monterrey. Tragically, on his way to visit another

Georgetown chaplain, he was accosted and killed by bandits.

Father Donelan

Father John P. Donelan (served at Saint Mary in 1846 and 1856), a young Irish priest. He was named by Archbishop Samuel Eccleston to be the founding pastor of Saint Matthew, a new church located just a few blocks from the White House. It began as a poor, mostly Irish immigrant parish and is now the cathedral of the Archdiocese of Washington.

- May 31. The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Recalls Elizabeth's encounter with her cousin, Mary, the bearer of the Son of God, who told her: "The Almighty has done great things for me and holy is His Name."
- June 1. Saint Justin, Martyr. Martyred in 165 under the reign of Marcus Aurelius. Layman and apologist who provided one of the earliest descriptions of the Mass. Patron of philosophers and apologists.
- June 2. Saints Marcellinus and Peter, Martyrs. Beheaded c. 303 under Diocletian; both are mentioned in the Roman Canon.
- June 3. Saint Charles Lwanga and Companions, Martyrs. Charles Lwanga and 21 Ugandan companions, protomartyrs of Black Africa, martyred in 1885-87.
- June 5. Saint Boniface, Bishop and Martyr. Anglo-Saxon Benedictine; founded abbey of Fulda; bishop of Mainz; martyred in 754 with 30 companions; known as the "Apostle of Germany."
