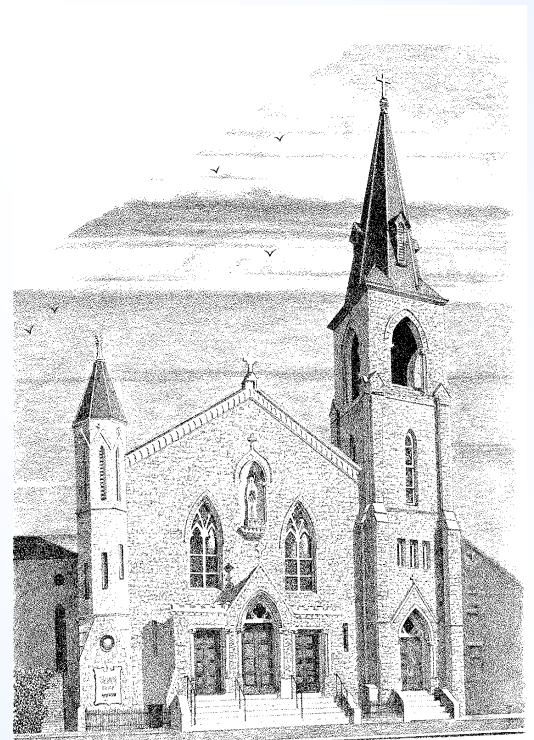

FROM GREEN TO GOLD

With the feast of the Holy Trinity this weekend we continue our "triple-header" of major feast days. Last week was Pentecost and next week we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi. I mentioned all of this in my last column, but want to remind you one more time of all that is happening next weekend, as it will be a very busy one. Because it is Corpus Christi, the day we celebrate the great gift of the Eucharist and more on that in next week's column, we have our Eucharistic procession following the 1:00 P.M. Mass. We hope and pray for good weather as well as good attendance. I also hope we have a great showing of our First Communicants. They will be four weeks removed from their first Holy Communion, so I am hoping they remember, or their parents do, to join us next Sunday. I had suggested to them at their First Holy Communion that they might want to wear their white dresses/coats and ties for the next few weeks. Quite a few of them did on the Sunday following their First Holy Communion, but I have not seen any of them doing so these subsequent Sundays. Perhaps some did and I just missed them. So, again, I hope to see them at the Corpus Christi procession along with many of you.

What complicates things a bit this year is that the diocesan ordinations are the day before, this Saturday. In addition, this will be a dual ceremony. Colin Davis, who was with us last summer, will be ordained a deacon and seven others including Deacon Dort Bigg will be ordained priests. Father Bigg, as he will be then, will have his First Mass here that morning. It will be the 11:30 A.M. Mass. A reception will be held for him after the Mass in the parish Lyceum. All are welcome! You can congratulate Fr. Bigg and receive his first blessing. Then please join us with the Corpus Christi procession which should start about 2:00 P.M. This is why I say the day is a bit complicated.

This past Monday, although not a complicated day, was Memorial Day. It was a beautiful day which allowed for our usual Mass in the cemetery that morning. We had just over 60 people attending. With this Mass and on that day we honored all of our service men and women who sacrifice so much for us and our nation. In particular we prayed for the souls of those who gave their lives in defense of our country. As a Church we do this in a special way during the month of November and especially on November 2nd, All Souls Day. As a nation we did it this past Monday, mindful that we can and should pray for our military and those who have died defending the freedoms that we enjoy here in America.

When we think of those who have died during the Civil War and even before that as well as during World War I and World War II and in the various wars since, it seems kind of ironic that as a nation we now seem to want to give away our freedoms and the very principles we as a nation were founded upon. Our Judeo-Christian foundation daily seems to be undermined. Sadly, many are outright rejecting any kind of Christian connection. No doubt as a country we are quite diversified and we can and need to respect one another, but it continues to seriously concern me how many people, especially young people, have no use for God in their lives. Certainly going to Mass if Catholic is at best an after thought for them. They simply can't be bothered. They want no higher authority "dictating" to them what they should do. I wonder if they realize what thousands have done for them in previous generations and the sacrifices, even the sacrifice of their lives, they have made. Seemingly, this means little as well. Thankfully there are exceptions, but the new norm doesn't seem to be a good one. So we pray!

CCD REGISTRATION FOR 2015-2016

Registration for the calendar year 2015-2016 is available and will remain open until July 31. Registration after July 31 will incur a late fee. Registration is available online at stmaryoldtown.org. Please see our parish Catechism/CCD Page for program information and details. You will also have the opportunity to submit fees in a secure way through our website.

Registration is for all children K-8 who would like to attend our Catechism/CCD Sessions. For children in 2nd and 8th grade who are preparing for First Holy Communion and Confirmation, they must either attend St. Mary's School, our CCD sessions or another approved Catholic school or home school program. All children in 2nd and 8th grade who do not attend St. Mary's School must register and pay the sacramental fee. The CCD registration fee, which is separate from the sacramental fee, applies only for children attending our CCD Sessions.

While registering your child and you realize that you have a child who needs to be baptized, receive his or her First Holy Communion and is older than 2nd grade, or needs to be confirmed is older than 8th grade, please contact Father Barnes to discuss how to plan for your child to receive these sacraments.
