T OCTURNAL ADORATION SOCIETY is an Arch-Confraternity (among the highest spiritual federations of lay Catholics) dedicated to silent and vocal prayer before the Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. During the night, Members pray the LITURGY OF THE HOURS (Office of the Blessed Sacrament) offering prayers of Adoration, Petition, Reparation, and Thanksgiving. Outside of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, this is the highest form of worship Catholics may offer. We believe that our Lord Jesus Christ – His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity - is truly present with us. Through this devotion and reception into the Archeonfraternity of the Society, members enjoy many spiritual benefits and salutary graces, both in this life and in life everlasting.

WE PRAY AT NIGHT FOR TWO REASONS. At night, one can attain the calm and quiet necessary for deep spiritual recollection and prayer. For many people living in this fast-paced society, an hour at night is often more easily set aside than an hour during the day.

We recite the ancient prayers from the Liturgy of the Hours in union with the whole Church throughout the world. Through this vocal and silent prayer, we follow the time-honored tradition of "Lexio Divina" – prayer and reflection on the Word of God in the Real Presence of Our Blessed Lord. This prayer has its roots in the early Church Fathers and the monastic traditions of our Faith. Night prayer also recalls the ancient symbolism of keeping vigil in the darkness, which draws our complete attention to God, Who is the source of all light in the dark world.

PRAYERS FOR DECEASED MEMBERS OF THE SOCIETY, are offered at the conclusion of each Hour, as a spiritual Work of Mercy. Our evening vigil helps to develop a sense of our own spiritual preparedness and expectation of our heavenly life to come. Through these ancient practices, NAS Members carry out the

time-honored rituals associated with Forty Hours Devotion, which began during the Sixteenth Century under Pope Clement VIII.

FOUNDED IN ROME IN 1810 by Reverend Father Giacomo Sinibaldi, the Society formally organized the practice of nighttime Eucharistic adoration for the Laity. In 1848, Reverend Father Herman Cohen, Jewish convert and Carmelite monk, obtained approval for the formation of the Society from the Bishop of Paris. From France, the Society spread quickly to England and Spain, then to Latin America, Central America, and ultimately to the United States.

IN THE UNITED STATES, Dr. Thomas Dwight brought the devotion to Boston in 1882. One year later, Reverend Father William Barlett founded a branch of the Society in Baltimore, Maryland, the First See of the United States. By 1912, His Eminence John Cardinal Farley of New York organized the American Nocturnalists under the Archconfraternity, then headquartered in Rome. His Eminence Patrick Cardinal Hayes established the Society National Headquarters in 1929 at Saint Jean Baptiste Church in New York City. Today, the Nocturnal Adoration Society consists of more than one million active members in thirty-six countries worldwide.

FOR THE DIOCESE OF ARLINGTON, Society Members in Deanery II gather to practice monthly First Friday Adoration at the Basilica of Saint Mary, the oldest Catholic parish in the Commonwealth of Virginia and in West Virginia.
