OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE Today, November 21, is the last Sunday in Ordinary Time and the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. With

this feast, we acclaim the authority of Christ as the King and Lord of all things, on earth and in heaven. This annual celebration also points us

to the end of time when His Kingdom will be established in all its fullness. Appropriately, the feast comes at the conclusion of one liturgical year and the beginning of a new one. Alpha and Omega.



Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas Primas ("In the first"), a response to growing nationalism

and secularism. Nearly a century later, we again do well to turn to Our Lord, who reigns over all people and nations, for strength and solace. While governments and political philosophies come and go, Christ is King forever. O Lord, help us to see You, to serve You and to give our lives to You, the only King worthy of them.

As noted in this column last week, **November 21** also marks the beginning of the Diocese of Arlington's three-year celebration of its Golden Jubilee – its 50th anniversary. Founded in 1974 by Bishop Thomas J. Welsh, our diocese, now one of the 50 largest in the United States, has a rich history. Our own Basilica of Saint Mary has been central to that story, reaching back to the founding of our parish, as the first Catholic parish in Virginia, in 1795. A: A prayer of supplication is a prayer asking God for a particular spiritual or material benefit. It recognizes God's supreme power over all creation and His ability to grant us what we need.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 2629) tells us: "... by prayer of petition we express awareness of our relationship with God. We are creatures who are not our own beginning, not the masters of adversity, not our own last end. We are sinners who as Christians know that we have turned away from our Father. Liturgical Calendar This Week

- November 22. Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. A day to rededicate ourselves to the truth by listening to the voice of Christ and to recognizing His reign by reflecting on and obeying His word.
- November 23. Saint Clement I, Pope and Martyr. The fourth bishop of Rome who died in the year 100 under Trajan. Saint Columban, Abbot. Irish monk and missionary to France. Wrote a strict monastic rule; exiled to Italy for denouncing court immorality and lax bishops. Blessed Miguel Augustin Pro, Priest and Martyr. Jesuit from Guadalupe, Mexico. During the Mexican religious persecution, he was accused of plotting against the government; executed on November 23, 1927, at age 36 while exclaiming, "Long live Christ the King!"
- November 24. St. Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions, Martyrs. Among some 130,000 Christians cruelly martyred in Vietnam during the 17th and 19th centuries.
- November 25. Saint Catherine of Alexandria, Virgin and Martyr. Following her conversion at age 18 in the early 4th century, she preached the Gospel throughout Alexandria in Egypt. While imprisoned by the emperor, she converted the empress and the leader of the armed forces; for this she was martyred. Legend has it that upon her death, her body was carried to Mount Sinai by angels.

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish

A periodic look at the history since its founding in 1795



LAMB OF GOD TRIUMPHANT SKYLIGHT



Located directly above the crucifix, altar of repose and tabernacle in our sanctuary is a magnificent stained glass skylight depicting the Lamb of God Triumphant. It was given to the church by the Feulner family. An 1881 article in the Alexandria Gazette reported on extensive church renovations under the guidance of Philip N. Dwyer, a local Alexandria architect. The article described installation of "a handsome stained glass skylight" when the church ceiling was raised by six feet.

The skylight consists of an intricately designed large rectangular skylight, measuring approximately the same size as the altar in the sanctuary below. Shown with the Lamb are a banner and Cross Bottony, a symbol of heraldry. The Cross Bottony has a trefoil at the end of each arm, and can be taken to symbolize both Jesus and the doctrine of the Trinity. The Cross Bottony is featured prominently in the state flag of Maryland, which was the first American colony where the practice of Catholicism was permitted. The link to our Basilica: The first priests to serve here at Saint Mary were Jesuits from Maryland. The Seven Seals, a series of end-times judgments described in Revelation 6:1–17 and 8:1–5, appear beneath the Lamb.

EDITOR'S NOTE: The skylight was damaged during a 5.8 magnitude earthquake that hit our area on August 23, 2011, requiring replacement of some of the glass and leading.
