Liturgical Calendar This Week

— October 18. Saint Luke, Evangelist. 1st century. Syrian physician from Antioch and companion of Paul; authored (c.70-85) Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel of Saint Luke.

— October 19. Saints John deBrebeuf, Isaac Jogues, Priests,

& Companions, Martyrs. French Jesuit missionaries to the Hurons and Iroquois of North America. Martyred in 1642-49.

— October 20. Saint Paul of the Cross. Born in Liguria. Renowned preacher and founder (1720) of the Passionists.

— October 22. Saint John Paul II, Pope. Karol Jozef Wotjtla (1920-2005). Born in Wadowice, Poland. As archbishop of Krakow, he took part in 2nd Vatican Council. Elected pope October 16, 1978. Made 104 apostolic visits outside Italy, promulgated a new Catechism of the Catholic Church and inaugurated World Youth Day. Canonized April 27, 2014.

— October 23. Saint John of Capistrano OFM, Priest. Proficient in civil, ecclesiastical law. Imprisoned while brokering peace in a regional war. Saint Francis of Assisi came to him in a dream and, upon his release, he became a Franciscan. Promoted devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus. Died in 1456, leading soldiers defending Belgrade against the Turks.

Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: Can I go to confession online or over the phone?

A: No. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a personal encounter with Jesus Christ through the ministry of a priest. According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (*CCC* 1484), "Personal confession is thus the form most expressive of reconciliation with God and with the Church."

Emails and phone conversations remove the physical aspect of this personal encounter, which must be present to validly receive the sacrament. As the Pontifical Council on Social Communications on the Church and Internet says: "There are no sacraments on the Internet."

Another reason is confidentiality. A priest is bound the Seal of the Confessional to keep everything a penitent says in the confessional absolutely secret. If the priest violates the Seal, he risks automatic excommunication (*latae sententiae*). Phone calls, emails, etc., are not necessarily secure and may reveal information about a penitent's confession to third parties.




NEW CHILDREN'S CHOIR SCHOOL

AROUND OUR PARISH & BEYOND

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish

since its founding in 1795



CHURCH RENOVATIONS IN THE 1980s

During his 10-year tenure (1981-91) as pastor at Saint Mary, Monsignor Frank J. Hendrick initiated renovations of the church, which needed major repairs. Ground water seeping upward was causing the plastered, interior walls to crumble. Monsignor studied old pictures of the church that showed the wall behind the altar once had wooden wainscoting. Wood would not repel the water problem Monsignor was trying to resolve, so he had limestone panels installed over the walls.

Monsignor Hendricks also moved the tabernacle from the left side of the sanctuary back to the place of honor in the center of the sanctuary behind the altar.

"I never felt comfortable with the tabernacle over to the side," he said.



He recalled that an Episcopalian gentleman who lived in the neighborhood visited Saint Mary every day to pray. That man told Monsignor that he, too, felt that the tabernacle, which had been placed on a temporary wooden platform to the side, was not properly displayed. To help remedy that issue, the man had a lovely embroidered tapestry made to cover the platform. He must have been happy when Monsignor restored the tabernacle to its central place of honor.


