MEMORIAL OF OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY – October 7 The Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary (Thursday, October 7) was established in 1571 by Saint Pius V to thank God for the victory of Chris-

tians over the Turks at Lepanto, attributed to the people of Rome praying the rosary. Called a "compendium of the Gospel," the rosary is a beautiful meditation on the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. I encourage you to pray the rosary often, even daily, especially as a family.

You can learn how to use sacred art to pray the Sorrowful Mysteries of the rosary at our upcoming 2021 Faith & Culture Series presentation on **Tuesday, October 5**, 7 to 8:30 p.m., in the parish Lyceum Auditorium. Our speaker will be Katie Woltornist, founder of **Behold Visio Divina**, a ministry that explores the role of the Blessed Virgin Mary in art. ### Liturgical Calendar This Week

—**October 4. Saint Francis of Assisi.** Renounced family wealth to follow a life of simplicity and obedience. Founded Franciscan Family: Friars Minor, Conventuals, Poor Clares, Third Order Religious and Secular Franciscans. Received the stigmata in 1224.

—October 5. Saint Faustina Kowalska, Religious. Polish nun and mystic. Her visions of Jesus inspired the popular devotion to the Divine Mercy and the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos, Priest. German itinerant missionary who served in North America. Died in 1867.

—October 6. Saint Bruno, Priest. Celebrated teacher at Reims and close advisor to his former pupil, Pope Urban II (reigned 1088-99). Founder of the Carthusian Order. Blessed Marie Rose Durocher, Virgin. Born in Quebec. Began the first Canadian sodality for young women; founded the Sisters of the Holy Name of Jesus and Mary devoted to Christian education. Died in 1849 at age 38.

—October 7. Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary. Recalls the rosary meditations on the mysteries of Christ and our salvation. This memorial was established by Pope Pius V in thanksgiving for victory at Lepanto on October 7, 1571.

—October 9. Saint Denis, Bishop, and Companions, Mar-

tyrs. First bishop of Paris. Martyred in 258. Saint John Leonardi, Priest. Co-founded, with Saint Philip Neri, the Collegio Urbano, which trains priests for foreign missions.

# Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

# Q: What does the term "incorruptible" mean?

The term refers to the body of a saint that, long after the saint has died, is found free of decay and decomposition when exhumed from the grave. The Church considers Saint Catherine of Siena to be an example. She died in 1380. Today, more than 600 years later and without any embalming, her flesh has not decomposed.

Incorrupt saints are seen as physical manifestations of souls in heaven. The incorrupt bodies are considered holy relics and are treated with great esteem in both the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox churches.

# CATHOLIC EDUCATION IN THE 1950S AND 60S: MORE THAN JUST DICK & JANE



The academic routine at Saint Mary School in the 1950s and 1960s was similar to the experience of millions of other Baby Boomers. The one notable exception was religion. As a Catholic school, Saint Mary students were taught primarily by religious sisters and religion permeated the day. Primary grade students, like their counterparts around the country, read about the adventures of Dick and Jane and Sally. But, unlike the public school textbooks, in Saint Mary's primers, Dick and Jane and Sally were Catholic. Their family attended Mass; Dick and Jane made their First Holy Communion.

Mornings at Saint Mary School started with prayers. The "Morning Offering" was always recited, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Occasionally, if there was a special event or crisis, the children prayed for a good outcome. When Pope Pius XII died in 1958, prayers were added for the repose of

his soul and for the Holy Spirit's guidance in the selection of his successor. These prayers were successful with the election of the beloved Pope Saint John XXIII.

Sometimes a student asked for prayers for a special intention. This could have unexpected consequences. One day, a second grader raised her hand (polite, respectful Catholic students always raised their hands before speaking!) and asked the class to pray for the 75-year-old lady in Asia who had given birth to quadruplets. She and her mother had been standing in the grocery store check-out line and read this miraculous news in a supermarket tabloid headline! In another incident, a third grader asked his classmates to pray for the lady in Brazil who had been abducted by space aliens. Since "Reverence in Prayer" was a grade on every report card, the teachers must have found it difficult to remain decorous with such extemporaneous, yet innocent and well-meaning, prayer requests! — Kitty Guy, Parish Historian




