September 14: THE EXALTATION OF THE CROSS, MASS & HEALING SERVICE



Tuesday, September 14, is the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, recalling the discovery of the True Cross of Christ by Saint Helena in 320. It also marks the building of a church in Jerusalem above the empty grave of Jesus. The present Church of the Holy Sepulchre was erected there by the Crusaders in 1149. Among the holiest places on earth, this church encompasses the crucifixion site of Our Lord on Calvary as well as the tomb – the place of His Resurrection.

Each Christian participates in the Cross of Our Lord by uniting our own suffering to His. In this way, we, too, triumph over our crosses and allow them to sanctify us. Contradiction and trials offered to the Lord with acceptance become a pathway of reparation for sin (our own and that of the world) and holiness.

With this in mind, the Basilica is hosting a Mass with a Healing Service, in conjunction with the Diocese of Arlington Healing Ministry, at 7:30 p.m. on **Tuesday, September 14**. The celebrant for the Mass will be Father John Melmer, former Parochial Vicar here at Saint Mary. In receiving the Eucharist at this – and every – Mass, we are touched by Christ, healed, reconciled and nourished spiritually. Following the Mass, there will be a Healing Service with additional time for prayer. The Sacrament of Reconciliation also will be available. You can find more information on page 5.

September 15 — FEAST OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS

Wednesday, September 15, is the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, a poignant title given to our Blessed Mother in recognition of her suffering and grief during the Passion and death of her Son.

According to Padre Pio, Our Lady of Sorrows is Mary's favorite title. It was through her heartwrenching sorrow that she became <u>our</u> mother. At the foot of the cross, Saint John was told, on our behalf: "Behold your mother." (John 19:27) Those are precious words for meditation. *Our Lady of Sorrows, pray for us!*



Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: Is Mary considered "divine"? Do Catholics worship Mary?

A: No. While Mary is considered holy and the Mother of God and worthy of our devotion, it is by the grace of God. She is not divine but still fully human. Only God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit are "divine" and therefore deserve worship and adoration. Worshipping anyone or anything else is idolatry and forbidden.

"This very special devotion [to Mary]...differs essentially from the adoration which is given to the incarnate Word and equally to the Father and the Holy Spirit." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 971)

FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish

since its founding in 1795



SAINT MARY AND THE SEPTEMBER 11, 2001 ATTACKS

September 11, 2001, began as a beautiful, late summer day. But by mid-morning, unthinkable acts changed this nation forever as terrorist-hijacked planes struck the Twin Towers in New York City, the Pentagon in Northern Virginia and crashed into a field near Shanksville, PA.

Many Saint Mary parishioners who worked in downtown Washington struggled to get home to Northern Virginia. Traffic was at a standstill on roads around the Pentagon and Metro service was disrupted. So many people were trying to call their loved ones that the phone system was overwhelmed, making it nearly impossible to complete a call.

Two Saint Mary volunteers were preparing lunch for the homeless at the Carpenter Shelter and David's Place here in Alexandria, Patrons there asked the ladies of Saint Mary to lead them in prayer. A Bible was located, and the women read Psalm 23 and several appropriate New Testament passages. They led the group in singing God Bless America. The sorrow of these homeless men was palpable. Several were veterans; tears ran down their cheeks.

As they learned what was happening, parishioners and others in the area flocked to Saint Mary Church, praying and, at times, crying. By noon the church was filled for the regular 12:10 p.m. Mass. Leaving the church afterward, worshippers could smell acrid smoke wafting from the Pentagon burning just a few miles away. People were drawn to the church throughout the day. Pastor Father Dennis Kleinmann added a special Mass and rosary in the evening. Many of those praying here were not Catholic but wanted and needed to do something. Dolan Jr. He and his wife, Lisa, were the parents of two children; one a student at Bishop Ireton High School and the other a student at Saint Mary School, Friends and family remembered Bob Dolan as a great husband and father, a family man who chaperoned his daughter's high school dances and coached his son's sports teams.

As we mark the 20th anniversary of the September 11 attacks this weekend, the memory of this terrible tragedy continues to touch our parish in many ways. We pray for those who were lost and injured and for those who heroically responded to help them. - Kitty Guy, Parish Historian

- —September 13. Saint John Chrysostom, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. Bishop of Constantinople in 397. Outstanding preacher his surname means "golden mouthed." Sought reform of the clergy; twice exiled due to royal opposition. One of four great doctors of the Eastern Church.
- —September 14. The Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Finding of the True Cross by Empress Helena in 320 and construction of churches in Jerusalem at the traditional site of Christ's crucifixion and burial.
- —**September 15. Our Lady of Sorrows.** Reflects on Mary's sorrows as the Mother of Christ and her example of perseverance through the many trials of her life.
- —September 16. Saint Cornelius, Pope, and Saint Cyprian, Bishop, Martyrs. Cornelius died in exile in 253. Opposed apostates in the early Christian Church who renounced their faith under Roman persecution. His ally, Cyprian, was decapitated in 258. First African bishop to be martyred.
- —September 17. Saint Robert Bellarmine, Bishop, Doctor of the Church. Tuscan Jesuit scholar and teacher. Canonized in 1930. Patron of catechists and catechumens.




