FEAST OF THE ARCHANGELS – September 29

September 29 is the feast of the three archangels mentioned in the Bible: Saints Michael (meaning "Who Is like God?"), Gabriel ("God's Strength") and Raphael ("God's Remedy"). The angelic hosts are organized into a sort of Heavenly Court – the archangels occupy the highest domains of this celestial hierarchy. They are specifically tasked with contemplating God, day and night, glorifying Him incessantly by preserving and protecting His mystery — that includes you and me! Their own names suggest their roles and their nature: All end with "El," which signifies "God."

Liturgical Calendar This Week

September 26. Saints Cosmas and Damian, Martyrs. Died circa 300 in Syria. Brother physicians known for their gratuitous care of the sick.

September 27. Saint Vincent de Paul, Priest. Born in Gascony, France, in 1581. United his parishioners to offer consistent, ongoing aid to the poor. Founded the Daughters of Charity with Saint Louise de Marillac. Saint Vincent died in 1660.

September 28. Saint Wenceslaus, Martyr. Duke of Bohemia; sought to bring the faith to his people. Killed in 929 by his pagan brother. **Saint Lawrence Ruiz and Companions, Martyrs**. Filipino priest and 15 others who were tortured and martyred in Japan, 1633 to 1637.

September 29. Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, Archangels. These three biblical messengers signify God's transcendence and loving care.

September 30. Saint Jerome, Priest and Doctor of the Church. Devoted monk and ascetic. Author of Latin ("Vulgate") translation of the Bible. He famously wrote: "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ."

October 1. Saint Therese of the Child Jesus, Virgin, Doctor of the Church. Carmelite nun, the "Little Flower." Her autobiography, *The Story of a Soul*, urges all to follow "the little way," seeking holiness in everyday life.


Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

Q: What is meant by taking God's name in vain?

A: Taking the name of God in vain means using His name or the holy name of Jesus Christ irreverently; for example, to express surprise or anger. Taking God's name in vain is a venial sin since it profanes a holy thing. Among the Jews, the word for God was so sacred that even the high priest could speak it only once a year, at the feast of the Atonement, when he entered the most sacred part of the Temple.



FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish since its founding in 1795



CEMETERY IMPROVEMENTS

Like most yards and gardens, Saint Mary's cemetery has always needed mowing, trimming and pruning. Old tomb markers sometimes break and are repaired. When he became pastor in 1999, Father Robert Avella planned to make major improvements, but did not have a chance to do that before he left the parish. His successor, Father Dennis Kleinmann, was determined to improve this "precious jewel." The bishop had given Saint Mary permission for improvements and work began slowly. There were many roadblocks, however, including a city-mandated archaeological dig. By Memorial Day 2003, most of the preliminary work had been done and Father Kleinmann announced at Mass, celebrated in the cemetery, that improvements would start that summer. This was to be the last Memorial Day Mass offered in the cemetery on a card table!

Apparently, things did not go as smoothly as he hoped. In December 2003, Father Kleinmann reported there had been little progress, slowed by a number of logistical complications. Fortunately, in June 2005, he was happy to report a new office/garage and storage/bathroom building had been completed. A new Royal Street entrance offered a "back door" alternative to dealing with busy traffic at the main entrance on South Washington Street. A new, gray marble altar, standing on two pedestals – one dedicated to veterans, the other to the unborn – had been completed. The altar was dedicated and used for the first time on Corpus Christi Sunday, May 29, 2005, as parishioners gathered there for a rosary and Benediction. The first Mass was offered there the next day, Memorial Day, with the Knights of Columbus standing guard. A generous donation from a deceased parishioner had financed much of the work.


