

Liturgical Calendar This Week

September 8. Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Although we don't know the exact date of Mary's birth, it is traditionally celebrated on this date, nine months after the solemnity of her Immaculate Conception, which is celebrated on December 8. This 5th-century feast also marks the anniversary of the dedication of a basilica in Jerusalem built, according to tradition, on the location of the home of Saint Anne, the mother of Mary.

September 9. Saint Peter Claver, Priest. Catalonian Jesuit who, for 38 years, ministered to African slaves, baptizing more than 300,000. Called himself "the slave of the slaves forever." Patron of Colombia and of all missions to Black peoples.



Q & A Exploring & Practicing Our Catholic Faith

In preparation for its 50th anniversary, the Diocese of Arlington is marking this year with the theme "Remember," reflecting on the Eucharist and Christ's words at the Last Supper: "Do this in remembrance of me." An article in the Arlington Catholic Herald (June 30-July 13, 2022), "The Eucharist Explained," explores various aspects of Holy Communion. Following is an excerpt:

Q: Where do parishes buy hosts and wine?

A: Many parishes in the Arlington Diocese [including the Basilica of Saint Mary] buy hosts and wine from Peter C. Munley Church Goods store in Vienna, Virginia. [Munley] sources the hosts from Cavanagh Altar Bread in Greenville, Rhode Island. Parishes can choose white or whole wheat bread, the size of the host and whether it is imprinted with a religious symbol, such as a cross or a lamb. [Munley gets their wine] from Mont La Salle Altar Wines in Napa, California.

[Some parishes get their altar bread from religious communities that make the hosts by hand. For example, the Sisters of the Visitation at the Monastery of Monte Maria near Rockville, Virginia, follow an age-old process for baking the hosts they provide to parishes throughout the United States. FROM THE ARCHIVES A periodic look at the history of our Basilica of Saint Mary parish since its founding in 1795



ACADEMY FOR YOUNG LADIES

Father John Smith, S.J., pastor at Saint Mary from 1830-1837, established two schools, one for girls and the other for boys, in Alexandria. A lot on the northwest corner of Royal and Duke Streets was purchased for the boys' school. A large brick house at Duke and Fairfax Streets was chosen for the girls' school, which was operated by the Sisters of Charity.



Following is from a June 25, 1832, newspaper advertisement for the girls' school:

Academy for Young Ladies under the direction of The Sisters of Charity

The institution is located at the corner of Fairfax and Duke Streets, Alexandria, Va. And will commence on Monday the 19th.... The classrooms are spacious and airy, and will be kept neat and clean for the benefit of the pupils. Besides the usual branches of female education, lessons will be given in French, Music, Drawing, Painting, etc. The Sister who will attend to the French department will use every exertion to communicate to the pupils an accurate and correct pronunciation of the language, during class and recreation. The course of instruction embraces the English and French languages, Orthography [spelling], Grammar, Composition, Writing, Rational Arithmetic,

Geography, Ancient and Modern History, Competition, conversations on Natural Philosophy, and Chemistry, Book Keeping, Plain and Fancy Needlework. Hours of Attendance: from 8 to 12 a.m. and from 2 to 5 p.m.
