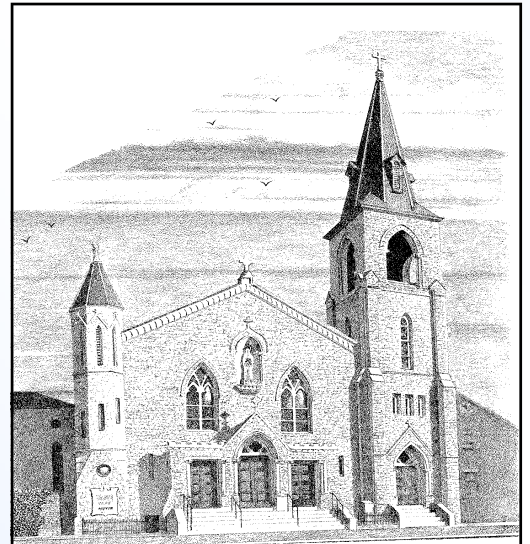

The blue insert in this bulletin is our parish annual report given to the Bishop every year. It covers the past fiscal year, 2015-16. I hope it will assist you in understanding the operations of our parish. We have received many blessings here at St. Mary, not the



least of which is a secure financial position for the parish. As a fruit of our Baptism, we become children of God and co-heirs with Jesus Christ to the Kingdom of God. We also have the responsibility, as faithful sons and daughters of so good a Father, to bring the light of the Gospel to our own generation, beginning with our own community and nation. I thank you for sharing your gifts of time, talent and treasure with our parish family to make this possible here in Alexandria.

The parish is the center of worship and the sacramental life, and supports the family in its role as the primary center for Christian formation, instruction in the faith and social outreach. Like any family, we have bills to pay – utilities, janitorial, grounds maintenance, staffing and so on. We also have many historic buildings needing regular maintenance and attention. Thanks to your financial sacrifices and volunteer efforts, we were able in the past year to educate 710 children in our Catholic school, 205 in our religious education program, receive 18 adults into the faith, baptize 122 children and witness 67 marriages; 140 children made their First Holy Communion and 80 were confirmed as Catholics. In addition, we have continued to grow our youth programs with Arragon and Kara focusing on grades 6-12 and young adults.

In terms of charity and social outreach, we contributed \$258,944 to spiritual and corporal works of mercy. We also provided many meals for the poor and the grieving through our volunteers at Christ House, Carpenter’s Shelter and others, including our Bereavement Committee. Through generous donations to ALIVE! and the St. Vincent de Paul Society, and volunteer work at Sunrise and Woodbine, we continue to care for the poor, infirmed, elderly and lonely in our midst with love put into action. Our tithing program, in which 10% of every Sunday collection is given to charity, has benefited the following groups in our local and international community of faith: Christ House, Catholics for Housing, Project Rachael, Bishop Ireton, Christendom College, Catholic Distance University, Catholic Charities, Daughters of St. Paul, Divine Mercy Care, Little Sisters of the Poor and Poor Clares, to name a few. These are in addition to the many special national and diocesan collections for charity throughout the year, such as Peter’s Pence, Catholic Charities, Retired Religious and World Missions.

These activities reflect our responsibility to proclaim the Gospel by our faithful witness and evangelical fervor even beyond our parish, enabling St. Mary to be a more vibrant center of faith and community life. This helps us fulfill the mission our Lord has entrusted to our care. Thank you again for your generosity to the parish through your regular tithing. May God bless you!



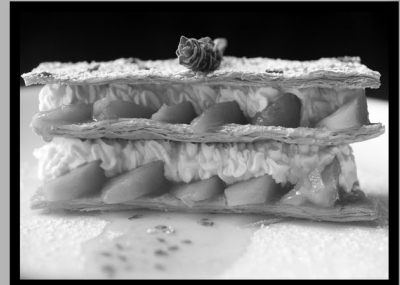
